Richard Butler

Carolina. In the Name of God Amen, this twelve day of September 1697 I Richard Butler of the Province afores^t being weak of body but in perfect Strength of memory thankes be given to God forraining to mind the weakness of my body knowing that itt is appointed for all men to die, do make & renewe this my last will and testament in manner & forme following that is to say first and principally I give my soule into the handes of god who gave it me & my body I command to the Earth to be buried in Christian decent manner in such place as my selfe may direct hereinafter named shall think fit without troubling doubtfull both at the generall resurrection I shall receive the same againe by the mighty power of god both touching such worldly estate wherw^t itt hast pleased god to bestow me with in this life I give devise bequeath & declare the same in manner forme following.
First & firs^t devise of all such debts & charges that one in reasonable & just sume & person or persons afores^t to be well & truly satisfied & discharged payed in some convenient time after my decease by my Executrix hereinafter named. To my son & heire to my grandson Richard Wickham one hundred & ten pounds to be delivered to him after my decease. And I give & bequeath to my grand daughter Mary Butler a sume of five pounds to be delivered to her when she comes to the age of six years. And I give the same to my Son John Butler one hundred & the produce of the Stock & Plantation w^t his late y^r and so long as he liveth in my lifetime till he comest to enjoy itt all the tenth coming out of the same. And I give & bequeath all my whole Estate both real & personal to take command as the power hands & possession of my deare Son John Butler during his life whom I constittute & appoint by this my last will & Testament my whole & sole Executrix & upon his decease to the said Son John Butler & his heires to be in the hands of his executors & administrators of my said Son John Butler his lawfull heirs forever & for want of such heires then the same shall be held in my hands possession of my deare Son John Butler & his heires to be divided among them. I will & desire that Mrs. Robert Butler & John Butler my wife & Son & Son be executors of my will & Testament. In witness my hand sealed the day & year above written.

I Joseph Barker of the Island of Antigua Merchant being at this time in perfect sense of mind & memory and in bodily health but my affaires occasioning me to be bound of a voyage for Europe & knowing of all my circumstances do make & declare this my last will & Testament as followeth (viz). my soule I commend into the hands of Almighty god hoping assuredly to be received by & through the merits & mediation of Jesus Christ my Saviour & redeemer to have free & clear remission & pardon of all my sins and to be saved. And concerning such goods & chattells afores^t blessing of god I do enjoy in this world I do now desirous (viz). Impairing & giving death unto my deare beloved wife Hannah Barker all & singular my Estates personall & real & all goods Chattells negroes land houses leases debts plate money household stuff or any other things whatsoever appertaining or belonging to me. I doe will & ordaine likewise my deare wife Hannah Barker my full & sole heire & Executrix of this my last will & Testament, my desier is that my good friend Capt. Richard Holloway be assistant to my said Executrix & for his trouble therin my will is that my said Executrix pay out of my estate to him the sum of Richard Holloway of sume of five pounds, - willing my said Executrix to see my debts be paid. In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand & seal this tenth day of October anno Domini 1697. Item. I give to my brother Robert Cranstone ten pounds but in case of his death to come to my deare mother Martha Doggett. Item. I give to my

Elizabeth Willdy wife of Joseph Willdy the sum of four pounds butt in case
of his death shall come to my dear Sister Martha Doggett butt in case of
his death before such time then all that is given her above to her to come
to my Sister Martha Wood if then living butt unless she be then dead then
to be divided between my brother Robert Cranstone & Mary Cranstone
wife of Thomas Cranstone butt in case of either of their deaths above
noted after them to enjoy the same. Item. I do constitute & ordain Martha
Doggett to be Executor of this my last will & testament. In witness

Item. Whereas of late I have been ill & unable to attend to my business
very much & am but of common understanding now therefore do make this my last
will & testament but I recommend my love & regards of all my friends
hoping through yr mercies to see me here again in health & strength so all my sons &
overlooking this, my long time & dear wife & the general welfare of my
Executor & Executrix to my worldly estate I give & bequeath to my son
John Cranstone being of full age with the sum of one hundred & twenty dollars
grant devise & bequeath unto my son William Bayley of same town lot in
Charlestown which was formerly bought from Captain John & great house
stands of late lived in together with yr fine house & all other buildings & yr
P. Town lott also my half of a parcel of land near Cornhill corner containing
fifty acres thereabouts wth P. purchased with my son Capt. Charles Basden
to have & to hold of P. Town lott buildings & premises there belonging to P.
parcel of land to my son William Bayley his heirs & assigns forever. Item I
give grant devise & bequeath unto my son William Bayley one other town lott
in Charlestown which formerly belonged to yr son Capt. John & wife whereon Capt.
John Glavell now lives together with yr house & buildings thereon, to have & to
hold town lott & premises to my son William Bayley during his natural life &
after his decease I give grant & bequeath of P. Town lott & premises to my two daughters
Mary Basden wife of Susanna Rawlins their heirs & assigns forever to be divided
equally between them. Item. I give grant devise & bequeath unto my daughter
Mary Basden wife of Capt. Henry Wigington one moiety or half part of my
fronting of Wharfe whereon I now live, vizt that moiety or half part of P. Town

town lott next to Capt. Rhett where Mr. Buckley lately lived. I have withdrawn
half town lott to my daughter Mary Basden her heirs & assigns forever. Item. I give
grant devise & bequeath unto my daughter Susanna Rawlins yor other moiety or half
part of my said town lott fronting ye Wharfe, vizt of P. Town lott & half town lott
lot & ye house wherein I now live, I have withdrawn half town lott & ye building
thereon to my daughter Susanna Rawlins her heirs & assigns forever. Item. My
will is of my three town lots situate near yo Market Place in Charlestown de-
scribed into three equal parts as followeth of front to go Broad street alias Cooper street
viz front to yr little street & run by St. Mark's & Mr. Remond's residence divided into
three of P. Town lots to be divided by straight lines running northward & southward viz:
third part of my P. Town lots wth 1st & 2nd town lots westernmost. I give grant & bequeath to my
son William Bayley during his natural life & after his decease I give grant & bequeath
of 3rd part of P. Town lots to my two daughters Mary Basden & Susanna Raw-
lins their heirs & assigns forever to be equally divided between them. That third part
of my 1st town lots wth 1st & 2nd town lots to my son William Bayley, I give grant
& bequeath to my daughter Susanna Rawlins her heirs & assigns forever.
And 2nd part of P. Town lots wth 1st town lots wth 3rd town lots between them of P. Town
town lots I give grant & bequeath to my daughter Mary Basden her
heirs & assigns forever. Item. I hereby appoint authority & empower my Executor
& Executrix hereafter named or any two of them to sell & dispose of yr half town lots
& unipurchased of the Henry Sommey & sons of P. Town lots
of yr formerly Capt. Blapp's to any person or persons & will purchase of same & money
need'd by yr late friend Capt. Bayley to pay my debts.) Item. I give unto my
daughter Mary Basden Susanna Rawlins all & singular my household goods
to be equally divided betwixt them. Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary
Sister my Indian girl Slave named Virginia. Item. I do give & bequeath
with my son William Bayley & daughter Mary Basden all & singular my ship goods
with my real or personal estate not already bequeathed in this will to be equally divided
betwixt them they paying my just debts share & share alike. Lastly I do
appoint my son William Bayley my two daughters Mary Basden & Susanna
Rawlins my Executor & Executrix of this my last will & testament. hereby making
null & void all former to the wills hereunto set by me made & declared
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal at Charlestown
the twenty eighth day of August 1893.
