

112 The last will & testament of Charles Armstrong deceased Bundle No. 102.
 In the name of God amen the twenty fourth day of August in the year of
 K.K. One thousand seven hundred and twenty five I Charles Armstrong of
 No. 1 James Island Street, Edisto River, Berkeley County 1725 and Province
 of South Carolina Planter being very sick and weak in body but of perfect
 mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefore calling unto
 mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all
 men once to die I make and ordain this my last will & testament that
 is to say principally and first of all I give and command into the
 hands of two that I give it and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried
 decently & Christian manner at the discretion of my executors nothing
 doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again
 by the Almighty power of God and retaining such worldly estate where
 with it hath pleased him to leave me in this life I give dispose and
 dispose of the same in the following manner given First I give & bequeath
 to my daughter the now wife of plantation on James Island above
 mentioned slaves stock immediately to let in my son Charles sonne to the age
 of twenty one years to bring up my said daughter Charles Towne Anna
 and after his marriage to let her in sole my said daughter wife
 Anna Armstrong or to her issue in sole in the same plantation & a
 reasonably maintenance & care my executors shall pay said Executors shall
 be charged off of the same and from time to time that she shall have no
 house or more than one plantation or land in her own name. Item I give & bequeath
 to my son Charles sonne to let him in sole in the same plantation above mentioned
 taking his inheritance out & until he comes to the age of twenty one years
 then the same to be equally divided between my said daughter Anna & Anna or
 the surviving them. Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Anna Armstrong
 one half of the land on James Island above mentioned that is to be divided amongst
 to her heirs forever and give & bequeath to my son Charles sonne to the same plantation above mentioned
 bequeath to my daughter Anna Armstrong the other half of the said tract as
 much that is there unoccupied and unbroken lands being forever. Item
 well that my second daughter division as above said my slaves & stock
 goods & effects shall be equally divided among myself and children Charles
 Anne & Anna Armstrong when my son Charles attains to the age of twenty
 one years but unless at his death within my daughter Anna arrives at the
 age of sixteen years then the same to be equally divided between my
 said daughter Anna & Anna Armstrong. Item But if my said daughter
 die before division auge in either of them the said lands shall devolve
 to my said son Charles Armstrong his heirs forever. And herein do I
 appoint my loving wife Mary Armstrong, Charles Armstrong my son
 Dr. Daniel Gibson attorney of Edisto River utterly disallowing
 revoking & disannulling all and every other former wills & this to be my
 last will & testament & no other.

 best of their deponents knowledge these deponents say they did at the same
 time subscribe their names as witnesses together w^t William Forster &
 Miles Rivers the other subscribing witnesses, in the presence of said
 Testator & at his request. Mr. Middleton
 Esq^r & the Esq^r & Clerk administered oaths to the aforesaid.

make this my last will and testamēt in manner & form following that is to
say I give and bequeath my soul to God that gave it and my body to the
Earth from whence it was taken to be buried according to the direction of
my Executrix hereinafter named and as for my worldly goods God has
pleased to bestow upon me I give devise and bequeath as followeth.
In first I give devise & bequeath unto Samuel Egleigh Caplin of Pickens
Egleigh formerly of this Province deced the sum of thirty pounds curr.
money of y^r said Province to be paid to his Master Samuel Egleigh
for y^r said Caplins use in six months after my decease. Also I
give devise and bequeath unto my loving wife Esther Barwicks after
all my debts funeral charges and the aforesaid legacy be paid all the
rest residue of my estate both real and personal whether lands
goods chattels rights credits or interest whatsoever and to herby
nominate constitute ordain & appoint my & loving wife Esther my
full & sole Executrix of this my will hereby revoking all former other
wills by me made & declare this to be my only will, written & witness'd
I humblye set my hand & seal the day and year first above written
Signed sealed published and declar'd by the
Testator as his last will and Testamēt
of Province agne 4th Month Peter Hall
