

112 The last will & testament of Charles Armstrong deceased Bundle No. 102.
 In the name of God amen the twenty fourth day of August in the year of
 K.K. One thousand seven hundred and twenty five I Charles Armstrong of
 No. 1 James Island Street, Edisto River, Berkeley County 1725 and Province
 of South Carolina Planter being very sick and weak in body but of perfect
 mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefore calling unto
 mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all
 men once to die I make and ordain this my last will & testament that
 is to say principally and first of all I give and command into the
 hands of two that I give it and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried
 decently & Christian manner at the discretion of my executors nothing
 doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again
 by the Almighty power of God and returning such worldly estate where
 with it hath pleased Him to leave me in this life by His own hands
 disposal of the same in the manner and manner following First I give & bequeath
 to my daughter the now wife of plantation on James Island above
 mentioned slaves stock immediately to let in my son Charles sonne to the age
 of twenty one years to him up my said plantation Charles Town Plantation
 and after his decease or if he should not live to my said living wife
 Anna Armstrong or if she should die in the same plantation & a
 reasonably unintermitting time my executors shall set my said Executors shall
 then affreight a boat and have ready timber and that she shall have one
 house or more at the plantation as she deems necessary. Item I give & bequeath
 to my son James Armstrong or if he should not live to my son John... Give & bequeath
 to him his inheritance and that he and his children shall have his
 timber his hardware and such other articles as may be necessary to him to the age of twenty one years
 then the same to be equally divided between my surviving children George & Anna &
 the surviving them Anna I give & bequeath to my daughter Anna Armstrong
 one half of the tract on James Island bounds that is to be bounded across
 to her new house and give her leave to have her new house at Stow. Item I give &
 bequeath to my daughter Anna Armstrong the other half of the said tract as
 much as she shall require for her dwelling and other buildings being forever. Item
 I will that my house and lands, plantation and all other my slaves & stock
 goods & chattels shall be equally divided among myself and children Charles
 Anne & John Armstrong when my son Charles attains to the age of twenty
 one years but unless at his death within my daughter Anna arrives at the
 age of sixteen years then the same to be equally divided between my
 said daughter Anna & John Armstrong. Item But if my said daughter
 die before division made in either of them the said lands shall devolve
 to my said son Charles Armstrong his heirs forever. And herein do I
 appoint my loving wife Mary Armstrong, Charles Armstrong my son
 Dr. Daniel Gibson attorney of Edisto River utterly disallowing
 revoking & disannulling all and every other former wills & this to be my
 last will & testament & no other.
