 -clare this to be my last will and testament in manner & form following vizt.

 be buried in such decent forme as my loving wife shall think meet. I then
 give & bequeath unto my loving wife Elizabeth Lindry all my estate real & person-
 -all w^{ch} now or doth may hereafter by any means whatsoever of right belong to
 me fully and fully to be held and enjoyed by her her heirs & assigns forever.
 Lastly. I do ordain nominate and appoint my loving wife Elizabeth Lindry
 to be my sole heiress and Executrix of this my last will & testament, utterly
 revoking & making void all others w^{ch} may have been heretofore
 made howsoever partly false. In testimony of w^{ch} I have hereunto set my
 hand & seal this fourteenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thou-
 -sand seven hundred and one.
