 goods and chattels wha soever And I give and bequeath unto
 my loving wife Jane Farewell the one fifth part of the other
 remaining half of all my personal estate of slaves Stock goods &
 Chattels wha soever And all the rest divided equally among my sons
 William & Steven & William & Steven to be divided equally to each one of
 them an equall part And I desire will and require that my
 son Steven Farewell shall pay to his sister Ruth and to his sister
 Martha the just summes of hundred pounds apiece to each one of
 them in full money of Virginia to be paid to either of them when
 at ye age of twenty years or time of marriage which shall first be
 or happen And in case either of them should dye before she have
 received her payment then fully her heirs shall be paid to
 her that both living or dead her heirs shall be paid to
 which should have had to her that is deceased and in case the
 deaths of both of them then one hundred pounds only shall be paid
 equally divided between my son Steven & William I desire will
 that there be a division again of half of all my personal estate but
 that it be done before my death to my son Thomas Farewell sometime
 within nine months after my decease to then give security
 for payment of the fore said money to his two sisters as aforesaid
 and further my will is that all the remaining part of my personal
 estate be sold one of plantation & managed to the best advantage for
 the maintaining and bringing up of my children until my son
 Steven attain to the age of twenty years and in case my wife Jane
 Farewell shall remain unmarried & single so long and shall soe
 like as she willing to live in the same house woe my son Steven
 shall have the possession thereof that then my Executors shall
 appoint her some other convenient place in the said plantation
 and my son Steven shall be at half y^e charges in building there
 a convenient house for her to dwell in during her natural life
 And I do hereby make and appoint Mr. William Waties Mr.
 Edward Thomas my son Thomas Farewell full and whole
 Executors of this my last will and testament And I do hereby
 disavow make void all other wills either by word of mouth or
 in writing In witness whereof I the said Henry Farewell to

 & ordain this my last will & testament that is to say principally & first of all
 I give bequeath and my soul unto the hands of God that gave it and
 for my body I commend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like
 & decent manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting
 but at the General resurrection I shall receive the same again by the
 mighty power of God; And as touching such worldly estate wherewith
 it pleased God to bless me in this present life I give devise & dispose
 of the same in the following manner & form 1st I will that all
 my debts be p^d by my Executors hereafter named 2^d I give the fourth
 unto my dearly beloved wife her whole dyet & apparel to be taken or
 raised out of my estate toles her privilege of being or dwelling in
 the plantation house where I now dwell or live for during the
 whole term of her life all things to be done & to be done
 & the care taken of my beloved wife as ordered by my Executors or the Executors
 by him made constituted or ordained in case my said wife should
 outlive my Executors 3^d I give to my beloved son Isaac Ingham
 whom I likewise constitute make & ordain my only sole Executor of

my last will & testament all singular my lands messuages & tenements & houses
furniture & moveables and also all and singular my cattle & household
effects and all my household goods & every particular thing or things that I own
call my own be it what possession or custody I have it shall be divided & be-
tween the said I give unto my son Theodore one English Shilling: And to my
daughter Marian one English Shilling: and to my daughter Madalene
one English Shilling: and the said I give unto each one of them by my death.
And lastly my will is that my son Isaac (after my decease)
shall be the sole executor hereof: my whole estate for everything aforesaid
mentioned I give in manner proper right forever: and I do hereby utterly
disavow & disannul all & every the former testaments & wills & bequeaths
bequeathed & bequeathing & bequeathed to be my last will & testament.

that I shall receive full pardon of my sins & that I shall be
rejoice in the merits of Jesus Christ my blessed Saviour & Redeemer
As for my body I leave it to the Earth to be decently interred at the discretion
of my Commanding Officer Lieut James Wall. And as for my temporal
estate

estate goods & debts which now is or at any time hereafter shall be
any way due owing payable & to be paid at the time of my decease with my
Spanish & any other money that has been received on account
by the John Portman after my Office sales all my subsistence and
debts due in this Company now in the hands of King Willm. Esq^r &
what times that has been paid to the said King Willm. Esq^r on any

here in the Fort at Fort Mifflin in Charles Town in his daughter's hands

Exchange drawn by me on King Willm. Esq^r & as also what money
he has laid out for me since May last only with this reserve, that Lieut
James Wall is to be fully satisfied by the goods that shall be left in his
hands for the full time of fifty three pounds thirteen shillings currency
which has been laid out in manner following: I hereby do devise &
bequeath unto Mr. Hissett for fifty one pounds five shillings & six pence currency & as also
debt of twelve pounds seven shillings & six pence which compleats the
said fifty three pounds thirteen shillings & six pence currency
I do hereby certify that the said Mr. Hissett has paid the aforesaid Bills drawn on him by me to the said
Mr. Hissett & that he has been fully satisfied by him & that he has
for such times as he has distributed from since my last will & testament
of my Spanish arrears my arrears & subsistence due in this Company
with the remainder of my effects is to be appropriated to the paying of my
debts which I owe to the Company to the over & expense of my family
This being my last will & testament hereby revoking all former wills
