Nervis. In the Name of God Amen I Capt. Philip De Witt of the Island of St. Vincent being sick and weak of body but of sound & perfect memory make & declare the following hereby revoking annulling and making void all former and other wills by me made. And first I give my soul to God that gave it and my body to ye Earth from whence it came decently to be interred. Hoping for a glorious resurrection thro' ye merits of our blessed Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ And for ye worldly Estate I bequeath pleased God out of his infinite goodness to bestow upon me my just debts and funeral expenses being first paid satisfied I give the same as follows
 I give unto John Haffan his maintenance from my Estate as long as he will reside therein withall appointing my Executor hereafter mentioned to assist him in y^e recovery of fourty pounds sterling p^{er} annum w^{ch} I owe to him after ye death of his grandmother. Item I give unto Philip Paine his maintenance of meat drink & clothes from my plantation as long as he lives upon y^e same. Item I give & bequeath unto these my God Children viz one Child of John Bignall one of Joseph Hill one of Lieut. Roger Earle and one older Son w^{ch}er was hundred pounds of sugar apiece. Item I give to my Godson Thos. Byatt fifteen hundred pounds of sugar to buy him a negro boy. Item I bequeath y^e former gift I gave of y^e third of eight thirds and hundred of sugar towards y^e yearly schooling of y^e poor Children of St. Vincent's Parish withall willing that in case there be not poor Children enough where Schooling at y^e rate of four hundred pounds of sugar p^{er} head will amount to y^e sum then that y^e residue thereof be laid out for y^e clothing and other necessities for y^e poor Children. Item I give & bequeath unto my loving Son John the wife of y^e then & better ^{now} Nothing one hundred pounds current money to be at her own disposal which I will shall be paid out of y^e money w^{ch} I am due to me from her husband's estate if there be so much and y^e surplus y^e shall paid to my Executor. But if there be not so much due to me from him that shall be wanting to be completed from my Estate. Item I give & bequeath unto my well beloved wife Sarah De Witt and her heirs or assigns one negro woman Holl and her three children Robert John & Abigail w^{ch}er latter and two horses therein to be belonging, as also I do hereby empower and give her free liberty to dispose of two hundred pounds money or y^e value thereof off my Estate by will or otherwise to whom she thinks convenient. Item If one half of y^e residue of my Estate lands plantations houses negroes stock money's rights goods chattells be left in this Island and elsewhere I give & bequeath to my well beloved wife Sarah De Witt with y^e half of the profits to produce thereof during her natural life & after her decease unto my loving Son Philip De Witt this heires or assigns for ever to whom also I bequeath in like manner the other half of all my lands plantations stock negroes money goods and chattells here or elsewhere that is to say Philip De Witt and his heirs or assigns forever. Lastly I hereby ordain constitute and appoint my Executor Philip De Witt whole & sole Execut^r of this my last will. Witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand & seal in Nervis this tenth day of February in y^e first year of y^e Reign of their gracious Majesties William Lilland King & Queen of England &c. Annoq^{uo} 1773
