Office pursuant to Act of Assembly, and was examined by M. J. Warden-
hall Esq. C. I. E., 1895.

In the Name of God Amen. I, the undersigned of the
County of York & the Province of Carolina, do make this my final mynd
and thanks to Almighty God for his goodness & mercies to me. In witness whereof I have
signed and countersigned this my will in the presence of the two persons herein named my
attestors all and weare with this my handwritting and this is now shall
be taken to be my last will Testament and same to the best of my
present and sondy from the bottom of my heart in the course of my life
past most humblye cravinge of God for grace and of the same to come, unto reme
my soule into his hands & to the Kingdom of heaven & my body to
the earth from whence it came to be buried in such place & with such
manners as my trustee hereafter named shall see fit to be most meet and convenient
believing that both soule and body at the General Resurrection shall resurect
and through the blood and merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ the Kingdom
of heaven prepared for his elect & chosen ones. And in witness whereof
my trustee hereafter named charging & commanding shall be made accord-
ing to Law of this my last will and testament after my decease to pay over
to be paid with such expedition she maye or can att each justable which
shall owe to any person or persons whatsoever in this Province at the time of
my decease out of such personal estate or stock which I shall then leave
and that my said Trustee as soone as conveniently may be after my decease
do all demand sue for recover and receive whatsoever real debts shall
then be owing and payable unto me from any person or persons in the said
Province and give such discharge as the Law directs. Also I give and
bequeath unto my daughter Mary Bill the wife of Thomas Bill the rest
hereof. Also all the rest of my goods chattels which I now have at
also my two lots with the houses as they are now built and erected except

the same. I give and bequeath wholly and solely to my loving wife Elizabeth
Keeling to dispose of as she pleases and thinks fit for her best advantage as
long as she remains a widow. But if in case of my said wife should marry
then it is my Will that my daughter Mary Bill wife of Thomas Bill
shall have one of my lots and house which my said wife shall please to give
her. and lastly I do hereby nominate constitute & appoint make & ordaine
my said wife Elizabeth Keeling sole trustee & executrix of this my last will
and testament. In witness whereof and in affiance of the said
writing as my true only last will and testament I the said George Keeling
have hereunto set my hand & sealed this seventeenth day of July anno 1895.
