these presents to be and contain my last will and testament, hereby revo-

heretofore by me made. First and principally I recommend my

receive full pardon and free remission of all my sins and be saved by  
the precious death and merits of my blessed Saviour and Redeemer Je-  
sus Christ, and my body to the Earth from whence it was taken  
to be buried in such decent and Christian manner as my Executors  
hereafter named shall see thought fitt and convenient and as to  
my worldly goods, which it hath pleased God to bless me with my
