In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand the day & year above written.

Carolina In the time of my life I have beene 78yrs.  
I Francis Jones of the Province of Carolina by reason of long life & infir  
mity of memory have made a will in writing in my  
weakness & my body & members therin so weak & feeble  
as to make to no man & woman & child in my family  
that is say. - wife & children & others & friends of God  
who gave it me. Give my soul to him who made me & my spirit in  
Christian & divine manner in such place as my soul may  
shall think fit convenient nothing desiring but in the immortality  
resurrection I shall receive the same again & eternally hereafter of God  
And as touching such mortall goods as I have please God to  
bless me with this life I give them according to his will the same  
in manner & forme following. First I will command that all those  
debts and debts that I owe in Carolina or Justice owing person of persons  
whatsoever be well & truly satisfied & paid in some convenient  
time after my decease by my executors after named. Secondly  
I give & bequeath all my Estate Real and personal to my well beloved  
wife Mary Jones my sons Francis Jones & Phillip Jones & my daughter  
Savvy Mary, Elizabeth Sarah & Ann Jones to be divided equally between  
my said wife and children to be delivered to my said children when they  
come to age today when Francis & Phillip Jones are one threescore years  
the female children are of age of fifteen years or are married & if  
so happen that either my wife or children expire this life before they  
come of age or are married that then my said Estate be divided  
between

between the survivors equally that my estate remaine to her & her  
occupation of my said wife whome I make & appoint to execute  
of this my last will & testament during my childrens minority. In  
testimony whereof I have hereunto sett my hand & seal the day & year  
above written.

my sole Executor. Item. I give & bequeath all my Estate both realle  
& personal to my wife wife Sarah & her heirs forever and always  
having made me my full sole Exe<sup>r</sup> of this my last will and  
testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto putt my hand & signature  
my seale of 20<sup>th</sup> day of July in y<sup>e</sup> year of our Lord one thousand  
six hundred eighty & six and in y<sup>e</sup> second year of y<sup>e</sup> Reigne of  
Geo. 2<sup>nd</sup> King James y<sup>e</sup> Second of England to
