No 2 The last will & testament of George Crichton Buncle A. No 2.  
*In the Name of God Amen the twenty seventh day of August  
in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred & Fourteen  
I Geo. Crichton of Bursley County in the Province of South Carolina  
Sick but very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind thank  
my thanks be given unto God therefore calling unto mind  
the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for  
all men once to die do make & ordain this my last will & testament  
that is to say principally first of all I give & recommend my soul  
into the hands of God who gave it & my body I recommend to the  
Earth to be buried in decent Christian manner at the discretion  
of my Executor without any doubting but at the general resurrection I shall  
receive the same again by the Almighty power of God has  
concerning such worldly estate wherewithal it hath pleased God to  
bless me in this life to me secure & dispose of the same in the  
following manner & form. I give & bequeath to Eliz.  
Wrightson my dearly beloved wife one third part of all my personal  
& moveable Estate to her ever here forever. Item. I give to  
my said beloved wife one Indian Boy named Arckstone  
Indian you named Sam together with all my plate bearing  
her or any other relatives names as also one bay mare  
formerly belonging to herself w<sup>t</sup> all the produce of said mare  
my best riding horse to her ever here forever. Item. I give  
unto my well beloved daughter Ann Crichton two hundred  
pounds current money of this Province to be paid out of my  
said Estate by my said wife on the day of her marriage over  
the age of eighteen w<sup>t</sup> shall first happen with one negro boy  
named Titus & one black mare Colt w<sup>t</sup> their produce to her  
ever here forever. Item. I will appoint that my said daughter  
Ann Crichton be maintained & educated out of the produce of  
my state as decently shandomy as the same will permit until  
she be married or that she arrive at the said age of eighteen years  
w<sup>t</sup> shall first happen. Item. I give to my well beloved daughter  
Eliz. Crichton an equal share of the remaining part of my moveable  
personal Estate with her brother George Crichton to whom  
to be paid delivered her at the day of marriage or at the age of one  
Twenty w<sup>t</sup> shall first happen the w<sup>t</sup> I give to her ever here  
forever. Item. I will that all my children by my said wife*
