

and principally being heartily sorry for all my sins past I command my soul to almighty God my Creator hoping and assuredly believing that by the death & merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ I shall have full and free remission of all my sins and my body to come to the Earth to be decently buried according to the discretion of my ^{next} heirs after named and touching the worldly estate etc it hath pleased God to bestow up me my will is that the same shall be disposed of as hereinafter by this my last will is declared and set forth. I command my will is that all my just debts as also my funeral expenses be paid by my executors before the same shall be sold short time after my decease. I give and bequeath unto my loving friend Joseph Moody of Lumberton in the State of South Carolina all that & those four negroes and Indians slaves of mine Jacob and Henry to hold the said four negroes and Indians slaves of mine to him increase until his and his wife's deaths and then to his wife and her heirs forever and likewise unto my loving friend Joseph Moody a house "over open" Spinster etc now in my possession and to hold the same in trust for the use of the poor negroes & Indians slaves to be sold by his executors for the same sum of £1000 or thereabouts to be paid to the poor negroes & Indians slaves to be sold by his executors to make my loving friend Jacob Simonsen a present of £1000 and to my loving friend Peter Deane £1000 immediately upon his death and to make an alternative provision which shall be payable to the poor negroes & Indians slaves to be sold by his executors. Item. etc. he command and desire that all my real & personal be the sum of £1000 or less and such sum before given and disposed of I do give and bequeath to my wife unto my said loving friend Joseph Moody and his wife Anne to be used by her to relieve him short and shrewdly least costly. I do hereby nominate to constitute & appoint the said Joseph Moody and his wife Anne to be my just will & testaments. In witness whereof I have caused to set my hand & seal the twenty second day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty two by the hand of Peter Simonsen Deane & John Stewart of the State of South Carolina.

Memoined On this twenty first day of March anno Domini 1742. I. D. Moore Esq. appeared before me the Hon. Common Council Law Stott of the City of South Carolina Isaac Deane Peter Simonsen John Stewart the evidence to the above will who being duly sworn on the holy Evangelist of Almighty God to each of them say that they and each of them was personally present and subscribe Moody the above Testator sign seal publish and declare their above writing to be and contain his last will and testament and that at the time of his doing he was of sound mind memory and that Peter Simonsen the other witness had written his name as such in their presence. Carolina. In the Name of God Amen I George Logan of Betty
County in the Province aforesaid Esq: being in perfect health of body and of sound
memory thanks to Almighty God first do make ordinance publick and declare
these presents to be and contain my last will and testam^t lastly prewritting
and making null void all former and other wills and testam^ts by me
heretofore made. First and principally I recommend my soul to Almighty
God my creator assuredly believing that I shall receive full pardon
and remission of all my sins and be saved by the precious death & mor-
tals of my blessed Saviour and Redeemer Christ Jesus and my body to the
Earth from whence it came to be buried in such decent (but not profuse)
manner as to my Executrix & Trustee hereafter named shall be thought meet
and convenient and as touching such worldly estate as the Lord in his mercy
has been pleased to bestow upon me my will desire without concerning in
the same shall be employed and bestowed as hereafter by this my will
expressed. Item. 3rd By will desire meaning is that all debts due
to me here and in all other parts of the world wher so ever as also the sum
of Woods a summe from the labor of the slaves on the plantation on
Thomas's Island where I now reside and the slaves on the plantation
commonly called "Queen" by the name of Hec-a-hoe where my son George
resides and has the managment thereof shall be appropriated and de-
ducted & appropriate the same for the paying & discharging my just debts and that
no legacy hereafter by me given or division of any part of my estate
made shall be performed & executed untill my said debts be fully paid &
discharged as above. Item. 3rd my will and desire also is that both
myself and my wife Children be and I do hereby ordene them in
Common out of the produce from the labours of the slaves of both the
plantations before mentioned untill the debts be fully paid and satisfied
by me given that then (now otherwise) their legacies shall be
obliged and I do hereby oblige them severall of them to pay out of their no
legacies a proportionable part of my said debts that shall be then due
paying as shall be computed by my Executrix & Trustee hereafter
named. Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my dear & well beloved
wife Martha Logan nineteen slaves (after my just debts are fully
paid and discharged as above) by name George, Maria, Captain,
Hopping, Jack, Jeffry, Cyrus, Pompey, Blackwall, Mercury, Queen,
Fortune, Janies, Adams, Blow, Judie, Phyllis, Amye, Cassandra
Amorall & Betty w^t their increase. Also give and bequeath unto
my said loving wife all the household goods ardding to

Butter, Irons, knives and working of what kind soever with the plates and
jewels that were actually and then furnished before my marriage with her
I likewise give & bequeath unto her my said wife all the stock with their
increase on the plantation where I now reside that is to say neat cattle
horses mares & hogs. Likewise give unto my said wife Seventy eight feet of
front land on the Bay adjoynig to the Northward on lands belonging to Maj: William
Blakely and there lots in Charles Town known by the number
also two lots at Beaufort Town and Kitchen by the number _____ also
segregated premises from which she doth forever otherwise provided and
it is the intention and meaning of this my last will and testam't that what
is herein by me given to my said wife shall be in full law
of all protection & jurisdiction to her mind & care that she may claim
to my said Estate in my part thereof by any law custom usage or means
whatsoever. Item. I doth give & bequeath unto my son George also
gave twenty sumes past due my testam't & paid to him provided by name
Duke, Primus, Oberon, Lucius, Brutus, Cato, Bell, Tom,
Adam, Austin &c & in case of his death or before he cometh to man's estate
Klarius, Nestor, Ulysses, Odysseus, Menelaus, Odysey, Nestor
he was bought of Captain John _____ he doth give & bequeath my said
son George the Plantation in my possession & many other lands
formerly bought of Capt. John & now continuing by Capt. John

I give to him my said son George this my will & to provide unto
it is my meaning that in case my said son George should die & out
leave then my will is that he become my successor in plantation of Charles
W^t the mansion house & all houses & lands & buildings to my son Patrick
and his male heirs and for my son George a man twice than to my daughter
Helen & her heirs forever. Item. I doth give & bequeath the rest
unto my son Patrick Logan his son & to my wife as paid as
before provided by name Hector, Jack, Indian, Hector, Glasco, Pompey,
Affe, Capt. Hammon, Haugay, Barthone, Indian, Estley, Indigo, Banow,
with their increases also a plantation containing by lot & grant four
hundred & fifty acres he it more or less & formerly bought of Gracie
Gracie with all thing thereto belonging but it is my intent &
meaning that if my said son Patrick doth not settle the forward tract
of land but returneth to disposed thereof his brother George shall have
the first refusal thereof and if he gives assent avaying other purchaser will
his brother Patrick then and in such case those other shall not dispose
of it

of it but to his brother George or to such other person or persons as my said son
George shall consent to. Also give unto my said son Patrick one silver tankard
marked F^t and six silver spoons also a bed, bolster, pillows, a pair of
a p^t Blakely's rugg an quilt to him and his heirs forever, And for want of
such all the before bequeathed premises I give unto my daughter Helen
and her heirs forever. Item. I give devise & bequeath unto my daughter
Helen Logan twelve slaves (after my debts are paid as before provided)
by name Frank, Tom, Tony, Morrison, Simon, Indian Tom, Maria,
Rosa, Betty, Cinda & Venus & their increase. Also give to my said daughter
all that my tract of land containing about eighty acres to the morrow
less & I purchased from Mr. John Wright deceased Mr. Hartwright and
Mr. Hobkirk both dead. w^t land leads from Charles Town up
the broad path into the Country to all the houses theron. Likewise my
said daughter on silver tankard marked R.C. six silver spoons her
mothers gold chain and a feather bed, bolster and pillows out of
sheets, six pair Blakely's rugg an quilt all w^t before bequeathed premises
Quilt to her children forever and for want of such I give & bequeath the said
premises to my son Patrick & his heirs forever. Last & 8^t I make
constitute ordain & appoint my dear & well beloved wife Martha Logan &
my son George Logan Esquire & son of this my last will & testament be
witness whereof I have to the my last will & testament set my hand seal
this eighteenth day of March 1797/98.
