

Miles Rivers' last will and testament Amblett to 49
 In the name of God Amen Miles Rivers of Ashley river and of the
 Parish of St Andrews in South Carolina Planter being weak of body but of
 perfect mind memory thanks be given to Almighty God for the same calling
 NO 49 around the mortality of my body and that it is appointed for all men to die
 therefore recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and my
 body to be Christianly buried according to the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named
 and as to the worldly estate goods and chattels God has been pleased to bless me with
 (After all my debts and funeral expenses paid and discharged) I give and bequeath the
 same as follows. I give and bequeath unto my dear beloved Son May
 one negro girl named A. Landa to him and his assigns forever and the same to be delivered
 unto said wife at the time of my decease. Also I give and bequeath unto my said wife
 all the land I had by her together with liberty to dwell in the house and plantation now
 living during the time of her widowhood. I give and bequeath unto my son
 Thomas my dwelling house and plantation and to him here and a negro person but if
 he happens to die and leave no issue then my wife is to have the same should go to the child that
 my said wife is now with in the womb and a negro person. I give and bequeath
 unto my said wife all my debts and chattels not heretofore given and bequeathed
 by me in the marriage settlement between myself and her now deceased Son Thomas
 before she died. I give and bequeath unto my said Son Thomas my share of the my last will and
 testament making disinheritance and making out of all other shares with out dissent
 before I give made. Also giving allowing and in other to be my last will and testament
 made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 24th day of
 February in the 10th year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Great
 William Francis and Edward being Governor of the Province of South Carolina
 Signed sealed published and declared before us the Notary Public
 Miles Rivers like his last will testament in the presence of
 Wm Miles Colver ^{his} E. Warden John Mason ^{his} Clerk
 and three

17 April 1777. Personally appeared before me William Warden John Mason and three
 Evangelists because they were present and did see the above named Miles Rivers sign seal
 and subscribe and read before and publish and declare the above last will and testament as
 his last will and testament and that he was then conscious and understanding of the
 contents thereof and that they subscribed their names as witnesses in the
 said testator's presence and at his request.

 South Carolina. In the name of God Amen this 24th day of April in the
 year of our Lord One thousand and seven hundred seventy and seven. I George
 Peterson of South Carolina in Berkeley County in the Parish of St John the Baptist
 being sick and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be
 given to Almighty God for the same do make and ordain this my last will &
 testament in manner and form following that is to say. I give and bequeath
 my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping and assuredly believing by the
 precious death and merits of our blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ to have
 an evermore full pardon and remission of all my sins and any body I commit
 to the Earth from hence it was taken to be decently entred at the discretion of
 my Executors hereinafter named. I give and bequeath all the
 funeral charges be first paid & discharged. I give and bequeath all the
 remainder of my estate after my debts be paid both real and personal be it of
 what kind and nature soever either in this Province or in any part of the World
 where it may shall be found more special that one tract of land containing
 some hundred and forty five acres be it more or less be it lying and bounding both
 Northward to the lands belonging to the Barrony called Matthee to the Eastward
 to the Northward on lands belonging to the Northward and being
 wife Elizabeth Peterson and my daughter Elizabeth Peterson to be equally divided
 between them share and share alike to them and their heirs forever. Lastly
 I give and bequeath my young brother William Flavell be it true only and sole Executor
 of my last will and testament making null and void all former wills and
 testaments and bequests by me heretofore made or intended to be made.

 the said George Peterson and that at the same time the said George Peterson
 was of sound and disposing mind memory understanding to the best of their
 Dependants judgment and that they these Dependants did personally subscribe their
 names as witnesses in the said testator's presence and at his request.
