

The Last will and testament of Charles Jones Bandler No 43
 In the Name of God Amen I Charles Jones of the Parish of St
 Andrews in the County of Berkley in South Carolina Planter being
 now weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to
 No 43 Almighty God for the same saving to mind the mortality of my body
 and that it was appointed for all men to die Therefore make this my
 last will and testament First commanding my soul into the
 hands of God that gave it and my body to the Earth to be Christianized
 and according to the discretion of my Executors hereinafter mentioned
 and after all my debts and charges shall be paid and discharged
 give and bequeath unto my dear beloved wife ^{Mary} Priscilla Jones
 my and her late master and chattels as followeth.
 I give and bequeath unto my dear beloved wife ^{Mary} Priscilla Jones
 my dear son David Jones the house
 plantation and land called Snow Hill and also the land which
 I bought of Mr. Thomas Jones adjoining to the aforesaid land which
 said land lies unto my said son Charles Jones and his heirs forever
 but if he should happen to be without issue then I do declare to his next
 brother that shall survive him and take his name and soon by male
 heirs up forever than the same may not be sold - Also I give and
 bequeath unto my dear son Charles and Thomas all my land lying
 up State river which is three hundred acres to equally
 divide between them while they live together but if it happen that
 either one or both of them should die or leave issue then the said
 land shall be sold or then used for the payment of their debts
 as aforesaid - Also I give and bequeath my negroes and slaves the number of
 six hundred dollars to my son David the number of
 Thomas Butler being called John by the name of his
 birth of the said Thomas Butler with notation the said lands
 come and go with them my will and pleasure is that my
 Executors of this my will shall pay unto my said son David five
 hundred pounds taken proportionably out of the estate before its
 divided according as the money is known or come - And also I give
 the negro boy Jack to him and his heirs it being given to him by
 his Aunt Deborah Woodman - Also with all my debts and
 funeral charges paid I give and bequeath unto the rest of my
 Estate goods and chattels to be equally divided between my dear
 wife and children except the part and portion belonging to my
 daughter Priscilla Emanuel the same my will and pleasure is to
 give to her daughter Sarah Mary and her issue forever except the
 incomes or other interest of the said portion the same shall go to my
 said daughter Priscilla's use and towards raising and maintaining
 her said child - Also the said Priscilla five shillings being her full
 portion. Also my will and pleasure further is to make and ordain
 constitute and appoint my dear beloved wife my son Charles Jones
 my beloved brother Samuel Jones Audury Sonnial Wm Webb or
 either three of them to be Executors of this my last will and
 testament

testament to see the same duly executed and performed according to my
 aforesaid will and pleasure and that my son David bring up to my
 good learning & for my business at the expence of his brother Charles
 Jones declining and making void all other and former wills
 legacies or gifts whatsoever ratifying confirming and allowing this
 and other the former will and testament. In witness whereof
 of these presents set my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of
 August 1726.

Henry Farewell

No 44 In the Name of God Amen I Henry Farewell of this
 Parish in the County of Berkley being of sound mind memory do
 make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and
 form following. First. I command my soul to Almighty God and
 my body to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors
 and as touching my temporal estate I give & dispose thereof as follows
 - etc. I will that all my debts & funeral charges shall be
 paid and discharged. And I give and bequeath unto my dear son
 Thomas Farewell all that plantation or tract of land lying on Shute
 River containing by estimation five hundred acres of land to him
 and his heirs forever. And I give and bequeath unto my son
 Steven Farewell the house and plantation Snow Hill in another
 one half of the land there unto belonging and joining to him and his
 heirs forever and also I give and bequeath unto my son William

Farewell all the other half of said plantation or part of land
belonging and joining to the plantation were I now live to him and
his heirs forever. And division of the said plantation shall be made
thereunto joining and belonging shall be made by my Executors
between myself Stein William as near as possible may be
an equal quantity and good & each one of them shall be the heirs
contented And give and bequeath unto my eldest son Thomas
Farewell the ninth part of all my personal estate Slaves Stock
goods and chattels whatsoever And I give and bequeath unto
my loving wife Anne Farewell the one fifth part of the other
remaining half of all my personal Estate of slaves Stock goods &
chattels whatsoever And at the rest division of my personal
estate I give and bequeath equally between my two children Stein
William and Thomas Farewell to be divided equally to each one of
them an equal part And I desire will and require that my
son Thomas Farewell shall buy to his sister Martha and to his brother
Martha the just sum of one hundred pounds before he reaches one &
one hundred weight wherein to be paid to either of them when
at ye age of twenty years or time of marriage which shall first be
or happen and in case either of them should die before the time
aforesaid he to payment them fifty pounds more shall be paid to
her that doth survive at such times as before expect dying that
which should have paid to her shall be taken out and in case of the
deaths of both of them then remaining hundred pounds shall be paid
equally divided between my sons Stein & William I further will
that there be a division of my half of all my personal estate out
that ye sum be delivered to my son Thomas Farewell sometime
within nine months after my decease for their joint security
in paying off the difference money to his own sister as aforesaid &
and further my will is that until the remaining half of my personal
estate as aforesaid of plantation & managed to the best advantage for
the maintaining and bringing up of my children until my son
Stein attain to the age of thirty years and in case my wife Anne
Farewell shall remain unmarried & single so long and shall not
like or be willing to live in the same house with my son Stein
shall have the possession thereof that then my Executors shall
appoint her some other convenient place in the said plantation
and my son Stein shall be at half of charges in building there
a convenient house for her to dwell in during her natural life
and I do hereby make and appoint Mr. William Waties Mr.
Edward Thomas & my son Thomas Farewell full and whole
Executors of this my last will and testament and I do hereby
disannul to make void all other wills written by word of mouth or
writing. In witness whereof I the said Henry Farewell to
this my last will have set my hand and seal this nineteenth
day of January anno Domini 1725/6

No 45 Daniell Freagent Testament & to do to
Barbara Bassakina In the name of God Amen the twenty
ninth day of January in the year of our Lord God 1728 I Daniell
Freagent of the Parish of St. Thomas & St. Dennis in the County of Berkley
in the Province of Conctrebia being of perfect mind memory make
before God therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my
body knowing that He appointed for all men once to die I do make &
ordain this my last will Testament that is to say principally & first of all
I give & command my soul unto the hands of God that gave it and
for my body I commit it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like
decent manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting
but at the General resurrection I shall receive the same again by the
mighty power of God; and as touching such worldly estate wherewith
it pleased God to bless me in this present life I give devise & dispose
of the same in the following manner & forme 1st I will that all
my debts be paid by my Executors hereafter named 2nd I give the greatest
unto my dearly beloved wife ^{Barbara} her whole debt & apparel to be taken or
raised out of my estate tales her privilege of being orderveling in
the plantation house where I now dwelle or live forsoaking the
whole ~~house~~ ^{time} of her life all things late done & suffered to be done
the care taken of my beloved wife aforesaid by my Executors or the sum
by him made constituted & ordained in case my said wife should
outlive my Executors 3rd I give to my beloved son Isaac Freagent
whom I likewise constitute make & ordaine my only Executor of
