that the will now produced is the very identical will then read to the
said Patrick Logan & that he approved every clause therein. That the
said Patrick Logan then put his mark at the bottom of each of the
said sheets & the deponent guided his hand to the place where he should
set it. and that the said testator mark and seal is to the last sheet.
That nobody being then present but the deponent & Major Blakewey
the said will was (after reading) delivered into the hands
of the testator who put it in his breast under the bed clothes & the
deponent

deponent & Mr Blakewey went into the garden & stayed about twenty minutes
that the other two witnesses coming in they all went together
to see the testator execute his will the being asked by them whether
his will the deponent & his kind pull it out from under the
bed clothes where he had before put it and then expressed himself
to them in the following words I do then from the special trust
and confidence I have in Major Blakewey declare that the will
now signed and sealed is the individual will which the said Blakewey
has read to me before. The said Thomas Cooper further depose
that the said testator Patrick Logan at the time of presenting his said
will was of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding
to the best of his knowledge & that he the deponent & his kind
thrust as a witness together with the other witnesses in the testator's
presence & hearing to his request.

And I do not Marimaduke Daniel the two other subscribing
witnesses to the said will being also sworn on the Holy Evangelists
depone that the said testator was blind to the best of their knowledge
& that they further depose they were not present at the reading of the
said will but that the will now produced is the very identical will
which the testator then produced from under his bed clothes
& declared to be his last will & published to be his last will & that
such publication declared in the presence of these deponents
that he believed from the special trust & confidence he had in
Major Blakewey that the will which he then signed & sealed
was the individual will which the said Blakewey has read to him
before. The said deponent to further say that the said Patrick Logan at
the time of presenting the said will was of sound and disposing mind
memory and understanding to the best of their knowledge & that they
thrust as witnesses together with the other witnesses Thomas Cooper in the presence of the said testator
in his hearing to his request.

my said wife my negro man named Sime tall his property whatsoever

shall think fit to all intents and purposes whatsoever. I order and
appoint that thirty pounds sterling be remitted to my loving brother
John Fenwick in Norfolk in Northumberland for so much advanced
by him to my father when living. Being entirely confident of
the sincerity & prudence of my said beloved wife & desiring of ^{God} that
her very precious & innocent Sime and bequeath unto her all the
remainings of my real and personal estate whatever her or
elsewhere need all that may become mine for the future tall
and singular y^e improvement of the same forever. And by her
my said wife after any part or parcels of my aforesaid real and
personal estate she shall or think fit to be disposed of as she
alone shall judge necessary for her by her sole will & man-
agement and disposal thereof ^{without doubt} of her without care
and zeal to promote the same with ^{her} pious works and at her death to
advance towards ye same as much as possible which are principally
intended & designed hereby. Lastly I do nominate & appoint my
dearly beloved wife Sarah Fenwick the sole Executor of this my
