I do therefore hereby attorne and appoint the said will to be duly proved thereby joint Last Testamentary to Major William Blakewey & Mr John Daniel the saids heireasund when giving the usual warning.

I doth now & then assynd to have examined and examined before the Honourable William Middleton Esq. President Commander in Chief & Ordinary of the Province at the Council Chamber in Charles Town on this day the twenty sixth day of Oct 1728 concerning the execution of the will of Patrick Logan deceased.

read it as the words appear in the said will to be provedd
that the will now produced is the very identical will contained in the
said Patrick Logan & that he approved every clause therein. That the
said Patrick Logan ther put his mark at the bottom of each of the
said sheets & this deponent guided his hand to the place where he should
set it. and that the said testator's mark and seal is to the last sheet
that nobody being then present but the deponent & Major Blakewey
the said will was therupon after reading delivered into the hands
of the testator who put it on his breast under the bed clothes of the
deponent

Defendant Mr Blakewey went into the Parsonage about half an hour
ago, that the other two witnesses coming in they all went together
to see the testator execute his will ther being asked by them wherein
his will the defendant said he had pullt it out from under the
bed clothes where he had before put it and then expressed his
knowledge in the following words "I attested from the special trust
and confidence I had to Major Blakewey I declare that the will
now signed and sealed is the individual will which Major Blakewey
has had done before. The said Thomas Cooper further depoſed
that the said testator Patrick Logan at the time of executing his said
will was of sound and disposing mind memory and understand-
ing to the best of his knowledge & that he the defendant left him
there to as a witness together with the other witnesses in the testator's
presence & hearing to his request.

James G. Scott Dr. James Ward Daniel the two other subscribing
witnesses to the said will being also sworn on the Holy Evangelists
depoſed that the said testator was blind to the best of their knowledge
believe they further depoſe they were not present at the reading the
said will but that the will now produced is the very individual
will which the testator then produced from under the bed clothes
declared to be his last seal & published to be his last will but
such publication declared in the presence of these deponents
that he believed from the special trust & confidence he had in
Major Blakewey that the will which he then signed sealed
was the individual will which the said Blakewey had read to him
by the said deponent further say that the said Patrick Logan at
the time of executing the said will was of sound and disposing mind
memory and understanding to the best of their knowledge I testify
these deponents notwithstanding thereto as witnesses together with the
other witness Thomas Cooper in the presence of the said testator

Do by his Master & Command of the Honourable Edmund Esq: at "Lambeth where he dwelleth" Robert Middleton & Edmund Esq: of this Province belonging to aforesaid Robert sworn on the Holy Evangelist to say this my last will & Testament with the handwriting & signature of Edmund Esq: in this Province merchant Esq: and therefore to certifye that the within Robert Middleton Esq: did make & declare to be the last will & Testament of himself & his wife together with his name at the bottom of a certain Sheet also the four first lines indorsed thereon shall & be said Robert Middleton's own handwriting more especially for the several reasons aforesaid in their depositions wherein is contained. So therefore hereby allow & approve the said will to be duly used thereby grant Letters Testamentary to Mr. Indian Allen the Executor therin named upon giving the usual security.

I give my soul to God my heavenly father trusting through his spirit by faith in his everlasting infinite Grace mercy to enjoy the complete justification of my person and

and Eternal salvation by Jesus Christ his only son the Lord my Righteousness I went through whom alone hoping for a blessed death & resurrection cheerfully giving my body to God to be decently interred according the direction of my Executors hereafter named. I will bequeath all my just debts to the said executors responsible after my decease. I give and bequeath to my dear well beloved wife Sarah Fenwick my negroes & slaves named Seede tall her posterity as also all y^e posterity of her formerly belonging to my wife Sarah wife of Robert Middleton Esq: late attorney to Charles Hill. I also give to my said wife my negroes & slaves named Seede tall her posterity whatsoever their respective increase forever to be disposed of among said wife shall think fit call intent and purpose whatsoever. I doo and appoint that this present writing be remitted to my loving brother John Fenwick in Morpeth in Northumberland for communication and by him to myself the when living. Being intirely confident of the sincerity & prudence of my said beloved wife & testiment of Estates her very precious & uncertain life and bequeath unto her all the remainder of my real & personal estate whatsoever here or elsewhere and all that may become mine for the future till such singular improvement of the same forever. And by her my said wife uttering part or parcel of my aforesaid real and personal estate to be sold or otherwise to be disposed of as she shall judge necessary for her to make her sole maintenance and disposal thereof notwithstanding her former & her now & her future wife and to promote therewithal her works and at her death to assure to same as much as possible which are principally intended to be given to her. Lastly I nominate & appoint my dearly beloved wife Sarah Fenwick to be the sole Executrix of this my last will & Testament. In confirmation whereof I sign my hand and seal this eighth day of February 1728.
