My last will and testament of Henry Livingston Buncle S.L. No 18
In the name of God Amen. I Henry Livingston of Berkley County and
L Province of South Carolina Gentleman being in perfect health and of sound memory
No 18 thank God for his former health and now in his infirmity his last will and testament in
manner and form following. Impunes I commend my soul unto thy dear
Redemer to be cleansed by his blood and fit for Eternall life and my body
to the Earth to be buried in the most frugal manner by my dearest wife Anne
Livingston Captain Anthony Matthews Jr whom I appoint Exec. of this my
will revoking all others formerly by me made and my worldly substance granted
me of my God I desire of her follows. I leave and bequeath unto my dearest and
affectionate wife Anne Livingston that tract of land lately purchased from
Master John Alston lying in the Parish of St. Thomas and St. Denis consisting
of three hundred acres of land lying between Master King's and that Master Colcock's tract to be disposed of as
he shall think fit. 11 Slaves and household unto my said dear wife
Anne negroes named Lucy, Anna, Walter, Barbara, Jenny, Pompey, Primus,
Robin, as also their cattle, household goods and all my bed and table
linen and the furniture in my bed chamber and humbly beg that my said
dear wife will accept of sum silver sums as are taken of my estate and
gratefull to her. 111 Slave to my two Sons Romeo and William
Livingston all the rest of my estate real and personal to be equally divided
between them. 14 Pounds and upwards that all my just debts to be paid
out of the monies that shall become due to me at the time of my decease
which if they should not suffice to pay my personal estate to be sold to make
good that deficiency. This I publish and declare to be my last will and
testament this under my hand

understanding to the best of these depon to knowledge and that they these
deponents thos. Bolen the other witness did severally subscribe their names
thereas witnesses in the presence of the said testator at his request
Executed the Livingston tooke the East
back Mr Matthews having renounced

In the name of God Amen. To John Hale of the Parish of Christ
Church in the Province of South Carolina Gentleman being sick of body and
in weak estate but off fat and sound mind and memory do make this my
will and testament in manner and form following that is to say I give and bequeath
to Almighty God, my body to be buried at the direction of my
hereafter named. First my will is that my just debts of general amount
be first paid and discharged. 2dly I give and bequeath unto my loving son Mr. Hale his heirs Executors & Assigns the house and plantation whereon I live
(except fifty acres of land after said plantation which I give unto my
loving daughter Eliza Hale) and also one plantation or tract of land
lying in the Parish of Santa Fe and the five negroes following Jack Clement
Mingo Peter Betty and Dido. 3dly I give unto my loving daughter Elizabeth
to her heirs Executors and Assigns two plantations or tracts of land
situated lying in the Parish of St. John near the strawberry and about
fifty acres of the tract of land or plantation whereon I now dwell and
the following negroes vizt Cypress and Judith with her children and
also five hundred pounds to be paid her at two equal payments by her son
Dr. Hale in two years after my decease or by my Executors hereafter
named, the first payment to be in one year after my decease, the other
in the second year after my decease. 4th All the rest and residue of
my estate whether real or personal I will that it be equally divided
between my two Children Mrs Elizabeth Hale. 5th There being a
contract subsisting between me & Mr Evans of the Parish Carpenter
he being security for me to Mr Wood having the management of my
Sawyers till that debt is paid my desire is that my Executors do still
(if the said Dr. Hale so desire) suffer the contract to continue during
my said year till the debt is paid over long among Executors she will take fit
6th My will is that my Executors do give unto my friends Doctor Daniel Johnson
Mr Jacob Bond and his Spouse a summing ring to each of them and
do hereby appoint and constitute my loving Sister Mrs Rebekah Hale
my Cousin Mr Sam'l Hale & Mr William Hale and Mr Thomas
Bridgeman Executors and Executors of this my last will and testament and
also my loving Sister Mrs Rebekah Hale Guardian of my two above named
Children hereby revoking & nullifying all former wills by me made and
constituted. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
the twenty fifth day of May One thousand seven hundred & twenty seven.
