

The last will and testament of William Norman, Bundle L.D. No 35.
In the name of God Amen. I William Norman of Berkley County in the Province of South Carolina Planter being sick in body but of sound & perfect mind and memory (Praised be God) do make declare & devise constitute and appoint this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say First and Principally I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping through the alone merits of Jesus Christ my Saviour and Redeemer to obtain full pardon and remission of all my sins and my body to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my wife and Executors hereinafter named. And as to the the temporal estate which with it hath pleased God to bestow upon me I do give devise order will constitute and appoint in manner and form following. I give and devise unto my daughter Mary the wife of Edward Keating the one hundred acres of land whereon they are now settled lying in Berkley County aforesaid to have and to hold to her heirs forever. I now I give and devise two hundred acres of land more in Berkley County unto my son Joseph Norman his heirs assigns forever. I now I give and devise two hundred acres of land in Berkley County unto my son George Norman his heirs assigns forever. I now I give and devise unto my son Isaac Norman two hundred acres of land more lying in Berkley County to hold to him and his heirs forever. But is my mind and will and I do hereby order will and declare that my said son Joseph shall have liberty to select and make choice of his two hundred acres first out of the above said hundred acres hereby devised to my said three sons Joseph George and Isaac. And if any of my three sons shall die before they attain to the age of one and twenty years and without issue of their Bodies lawfully begotten that then the said two hundred acres of land or them so dying shall go to the surviving brother or brothers and to his or their heirs forever. Item All that my last of land containing by estimation three hundred acres more or less) lying and being at this time at Brown County in the said Province of Carolina I give and devise unto my daughter Rachell Norman her heirs and assigns forever. I now I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Norman the third of my personal estate order and devise that she shall have the use of my plantation and I have to be taught and educate my said children till my said son Joseph attains to the age of one and twenty years. I now All the rest of goods and Chattels not herein before given and bequeathed (after my debts and funeral expenses are satisfied & paid) I will give & bequeath unto my said sons Joseph George and Isaac and to my daughter Rachell Sarah and Rebecca to be equally divided amongst them. And I do hereby make my trusty & well beloved friends Mr Robert How and my brother in law Mr John Oldfield Executors of this my last will and testament reserving nothing and declaring said at all the former with by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and seal this eleventh

day of July in the fourth year of our Sovereign Lord George the fourth
Witness the aforesaid Dominus 1778.

And the Deponents further say that they saw William Weston subscribe his name as a witness at the instance of the testator in his presence.

In the name of God Amen I Hugh Harding Mariner and at present Master of the Snow John and Mary of Bristol being very sick and weak in body but of perfect and sound mind and memory (Praised be God) Considering my present weakness and indisposition do make this my will and testament in manner and form following. I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping through his great mercy Death passion merits intercession of my dear Saviour & Redeemer Jesus Christ the righteous to obtain full and free pardon of all my sins and my body I commit to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named And I do hereby nominate and appoint my good friend Capt Thomas Bellman Mariner to be my Executor in trust in all my affairs here in this Province and do hereby desire and request him that he do call on Mr Bellman to take all the necessary and needful care and charge of the said Snow John and Mary and all her furniture as also of her loading and everything unto her belonging and that he do send Thomas Bellman will order and direct that the said Snow be fitted and provided with all necessary proper and convenient

her proceeding on her voyage to Bristol and to take care that nothing
be embayled and that her loading now at home be redright on board
said Snow in good order and towed well away. And I do hereby
inpower my said Executor to direct the said Thomas Dolman to
attend and appoint and pull outboard the said Snow after my decease
such a fitt and able person as assistant or commander of her as shall
be capable to navigate the said Snow to the Port of Bristol Great
Brittain and after her arrival there to deliver her unto John King Esq^r
sole Owner thereof unto his assigns that he also deliver her loading
to such persons as the same is consigned to by bills of lading signed
by me And I do hereby inpower the said Thomas Dolman to do the
do what things relating to the said Snow before then the said
as he shall think may be much expedient for the interest of the

In the Name of God Amen. I William Tutton of Charleston
in the Province of South Carolina Vicariller being well of body and
of sound and perfect mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God
for the same but considering the transitory of this transitory life
doe make ordain and declare this to be my last will and testament
and first and principally I commend my soul to Almighty God my Creator

and my body I commit to the Earth to be buried in such Christian Buriall
among Buriall houses as shall think fitt and according
my worldly Estate which it hath pleased God to bestow upon me
that I like same shall be disposed of in manner as hereinafter by this my
will is declared and sett forth. Inprimis I do hereby order that
all my just debts as also my funerall expenses be paid in some short
time after my decease. Item I give devise and bequeath unto my
wellbelovd Wife Mary Tutton all my estate as well real as personal
within the Province or elsewhere to hold the same unto my said Wife during
her heirs Executors administrators and assigns to the one of them
betwixt of my said Wife Mary Tutton her heirs Executors Administrators and
assigns forever. Item I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint
my said loving Wife Mary Robert White of Charleston in the
County of Southwell with Kingdom of Great Britain Bechose and Executor
of this my last will and testament And lastly I do hereby make
and make null void all and all manner of former and other wills
and codicills by me heretofore made declaring this only to be and
contain my last will and testament. In Witness whereof I have
to this my last will testament sett my hand and seal the thirtieth
day of September in the thirtieth year of the Reign of our Sovereign
Lord George by the Grace of God of Great Brittain France and Ireland
King Defender of the Faith &c And in the year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and twenty six.
