worldly estate with which it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me
I give devise and dispose of as follows etc vj. My will is and I do hereby
order and direct that all my estate be equally divided and distributed
between my dear mother Mrs. Grace Palmer and my four children
Hannah Palmer Robert Palmer John Palmer Joseph Palmer the
undersigned like that part to my mother take determined to her assessment
possible after my decease and my childrens part take paid to them and
each of them as they shall come by age to receive the same as hereafter
mentioned And my will further is that in case any of my 4 children
should die before they come to the age of twenty one years that such part so
intended for the deceased shall be appropriated to the survivors and equally
to be distributed among them share and share alike And it is further my
will that my daughter part shall be paid in at the day of marriage or
when she attains to the age of twenty one years which shall first happen
And it is also my will that my said four children shall be maintained
out of the profits arising out of my personal estate in the best manner
that can be which I leave to the prudence discretion of my Executor
hereafter named And I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint
my good friends Mr. Isaac Allen and Mr. Joseph Bragg of Charles Town
Merchants Executors of my last will and testament not doubting but
they will take all due care in managing up and down the education of my children
and in the managing of my affairs to the best advantage trustee of
my said children by my last will and testament made by testimony whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this ninth month day of September
in the seventh year of his Majesties reign in the year of our Lord
one thousand seven hundred twenty one and four.

La Porte ma veuve quarante Pièces de Cent qui leur seront payées par mes

par Chacun au et ellenc pourra disposer au fond de la dette de la dite Anne
quelque preste que ce puisse être et déclaré par les presents Jacques Le

Memorandum. That by virtue of a Ecclesiastic Commission from the Honourable
Arthur Middleton Esq. President here in Cheye in and over his Majestys
Province of South Carolina and Ordinary of the same, directed to me James
Nicholas Maynard Esq. One of his Majestys Justices assigned to keepe the
Peace in Ravenel County and Province aforesaid to take the Probate of the
last will & testament of James St Grand Esq. deceased I have caused Stephen
Turney & Abraham Laurent to appear to the said will heare and
personally to appear before me the second day of October anno Domini 1725 who
being dilligently sworne on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God, say that they were
present when the said James St Grand Esq. acknowledged the signature James St Grand
de Loubry assigned upon the said will to make and to do all and further
and the same in the margin to be his seal and did declare in thicre presence
that the said deed of writing was his last will & testament and that they the
said Stephen Turney & Abraham Laurent to have subscribed their names as
witnesses therof as appears upon the said will & that they saw James St Grand
sign as witness as they did to the same and further the deponent sayeth
