Memorandum This fifth day of May Anno Domini 1730<sup>th</sup> Sonably came to appear before James Moore Esq<sup>r</sup> Gov<sup>r</sup> & C<sup>o</sup> and Assembly of the Province of South Carolina John Simmons and Richd Waring who being duly sworn say that they and each of them were personally present and did see therewith named John Stevens sign and seal and as for his last will testam't published and declare the above written instrument tales that they did subscribe their names as witnesses in the presence of the said Testator also that the said John Stevens at<sup>t</sup> time of his publishing such his last will and testam't was of sound mind & memory that Samuel Jamison was personally present and subscribed his name as a witness in testimony whereof I have hereunto sett my hand the day and year above written.

the County of Craven in the Province of South Carolina do now in good health of body mind sound in judgment and memory have therfore given to Almighty God my body and灵魂 this my present last will and testam't in manner and forme following that is to say Imprimis first and principally I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping through the mercie & death and passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ to have full and free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins and to inherit everlasting life my body bound to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as touching the disposition of all such temporal estate which hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me I give and dispose thereof as followeth Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Judith Pennington my negro boy Essex by name all my house & lands & house furniture and one bed, being in tract I give & bequeath all horses mares & cattle whatsoever belongeth to me at and every particular thing worth naming several diversing Mr John Beaman & Mr Randolph Evers to see that she may not be wronged outby thing leaving them as Executors hoping that will do for the best if she be att chld I desire that if it be a boy he may have the houses and lands and other things to be equally divided between them self & a boy or girl. liquidate in the presence of Peter Pennington Sam'l Scott

No 19 Richard Vincent considering the mortality of mankind the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time of it have thought fit to dispose of what it hath pleased God to give me, recommending firstly to the merciful hands of God and of our Saviour Jesus Christ and my body to the Earth to be buried in decent and Christian like manner as my Friends hereafter named shall think fit. And that my will may be better formed I constitute and appoint my dearely beloved wife Martha Vincent wife of said Squire and bequeath one fourth part of my lands slaves goods and chattels to be by her and her heirs fully possessed and enjoyed forever. Item To my beloved daughter Anne Vincent and her heirs forever I give and bequeath one fourth part of my said lands slaves goods and chattels to be by her fully possessed and enjoyed - and one gray horse named Sally. Item To my well beloved daughter Mary Vincent and her heirs forever I give and bequeath one fourth part of my lands slaves goods & chattels to be by her fully possessed and enjoyed. Item To my well beloved daughter Kathrina Vincent I give and bequeath one fourth part of my Estates lands slaves goods & chattels asforesaid to be by her heirs fully possessed & enjoyed forever. Lastly. Respecting and concerning of this my last will and testam't is, that my Estate, aforesaid moveable and immovable after my debts aforesaid are paid shall after my decease as soon as possible be equally and quietly shared & divided between my above named wife and my said three daughters and to the longest live of them, and my said wife to live on my plantation whilst a widow and no longer, to manage my Estate to her own & my children's advantage, both if she marries. To have & share & use of my plantation. If my estate by loss or otherwise decrease or become insufficient my wife is that everyone concerned shall be a proportionable loss. Item I will have no lawsuit about what I leave but all differences submitted to her or state friend or neighbors. Lastly I declare what is above written to be my last will and testam't desiring its may take effect notwithstanding any neglect
