memory thinks best to God my soul to make & ordain this my last will & testament in
memory of my decease. I give & bequeath all my lands leasements &
possessions & I now have in the County of Berkeley aforesaid together with their several offices
appearances unto Sam'l Charleston of Dublin in the Kingdom of Ireland testam^t my
stepson Son of Sam'l Charleston late of Dublin in the County of Cork in the Kingdom
of Ireland. But deceased & to Elias Ball son of William Ball half brother of aforesaid
John Alexander my most beloved husband. I have & hold of P. Land timber & woods
belonging to S. John Charleston & Elias Ball in joint tenancy & to their respective
sons to come. Sam'l Charleston & Elias Ball all my negroes &
slaves & other chattel furniture goods debts & chattels to be equally divided between
them. Lastly I do instruct & command Charles Burnham & James Child
both of Berkeley County aforesaid to be my Execut^t of this my last will & testament.
To give to each of them of sum of them per month as a token of my esteem toward
them & of my trouble they may have in being my Execut^t. Inscribrees
