In the Name of God Amen I call to witness before me the Testators above named & others
that I do make and declare this my last will and testamēt in the following
manner & form. I give and bequeath all my lands & other w^ts
and chattels by me hereinafter named or to come in the following
manner & above all I do give and bequeath to Robt. son of
John & Susanna Clapp his wife, all my money and
what I receive in my lifetime, and my debts due to him, what
he will, and my body to g^t earth in a decent shroud & to be secretly buried
in my grave lott in Chancery Ward lying or being at the discretion
of my Executors in trust belonging to me at the time of my death.
Item. My just debts which I shall owe to me at the time of my death
and my funerall expences being duly paid & discharged from the residue
among my beloved daughter Sarah Cottingham, in whose hands I leave my
estate & every thing unto her to be disposed of
what nature qualitie or condition soever shee may require
whatsoever is or shall be remaining in my possession belonging unto me by
bond, billbooks, wayes & other contracts & dealings mine within this Province
or elsewhere, the same to be excepted after all g^t age of eighteen years
or day of marriage which shall first happen. Item. I do appoint &
ordaine my loving friends Edward Stays & Sue Laddson both of this place
take executors in trust in the behalfe of my beloved daughter Sarah Cottingham
and desirous & beseeching them as they will answer it at the great
day of Acc^t. wherein every man must give an acc^t of y^e deeds done in
g^t body whether good or ill that they see that this my last will and
testamēt is duly executed and performed according as I have ment^t intended.
Now I give and bequeath unto my servant Benjamin Ladd twenty shillings

to help to buy him necessaries and his freedom as the time cometh
after my decease according to the direction of my Executors in trust
Item. My will & pleasure is f^{or}d^t that my beloved maid Dorothy Ladd
have her freedom in short time after my decease as my Executors shall see fit.
Item. Give the residue unto my loving friends Edward Stays &
John Laddson whome I have appointed my Executors in trust in the behalfe
of my beloved daughter Sarah Cottingham the sume of fifteen pounds ster
a piece to buy them a hatt. Item. I desire and bequeath my Executor
before named to see that my daughter Sarah Cottingham be brought
up in all good learning, at reading writing & sowing, & to some assay
estate of lands & houseing, or what else doth appear to determine how
ould money or bills of Exchange can be p̄cured to send my daughter
to London to her relations there w^t I desire my Executors to do as follows
as they can. And this I doe publish to y^e world as my last will
& testamēt. In witness wherefore I set my hand & fire my seal this
xxiii day of Decemb^r in y^e year of An^t 2d^r (1692)

November the 9th 1692. In the Name of God and in God's
name, I bequeath my soule & body to God. and further I be-
queath to my child if living one hundred pounds in gold with y^e
two bills of one hundred pounds apiece; y^e one upon Capt George Scarffey
in Carolina, the other on Mr. Jonathan Amore Attorney at Law.
To y^e Master of y^e Sloope Dolphew ten pounds vñt William Day. To
Crispine Squire fifty shillings. To all in y^e Sloope twenty shillings
apiece. To Robert Fenwick y^e remainder of all my money gold
chattels whatsoever. And by this my last will and testamēt do engrue
y^e said Fenwick to act for me for my behalfe in case I shall
myselfe not be present, in discharging y^e things above herein mentioned
Child be not living y^e said legacy to my brother Mariano
