son of Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina Church^{man} being
sick in body but of sound & free mind & memory give & bequeath to
Almighty God for the same considering the uncertainty of death and the
uncertainty of the time thereof to make testament this my last will & testa-
ment in manner & form following. First I bequeath my soul into the hands
of Almighty God my merciful Father of Jesus Christ my blessed Redeem-
er beseeching him to receive ^{me} into ^{his} heavenly mercy hoping
assuredly believing the salvation & mercy sent through the alone merits
of Jesus Christ my blessed Redeemer my body I commit to the Earth to be
decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named being
in full & certain hope of a resurrection to a glorious immortality in the
great days of our Saviours second coming to judge the world for my
estate which it hath pleased God to bestow upon me in this world I do give
& dispose of the same as followeth viz. Imp^{ort} I give & bequeath that all my just
debts & funeral expenses shall be first paid & discharged. Item I do give
devise & bequeath unto William Rhett Jun^r (son of William Rhett of
Charles Town Church^{man}) his Executors Administrators assigns forever the sum of
two hundred pounds Curr^{ent} money of Carolina. Item I do give devise &
bequeath to Sarah Rhett daughter of the said William Rhett her Executors
Administrators assigns forever the sum of two hundred pounds Curr^{ent} money
of Carolina. Item I do give devise & bequeath to the said William Rhett
Jun^r his Executors Administrators assigns forever the sum of two hundred pounds
Curr^{ent} money of Carolina. Item I do give devise & bequeath to the said
William Rhett Jun^r his wife their Executors Administrators assigns forever
the sum of two hundred pounds Curr^{ent} money of Carolina. And I do
also give devise & bequeath to the said William Rhett Sarah his wife their
Executors Administrators assigns forever the sum of one hundred pounds
Sterling money of England ^{which} I have now lying in the hands of Mr
Robert South of London Merchants. Item I do give devise & bequeath to
the said Sarah Rhett wife of the said William Rhett her Executors
Administrators assigns forever my negro boy called Snowball. Item I do

do give devise & bequeath to the poor of the Parish of St. Phillips Charles Town the sum
of twenty pounds Curr^{ent} money of Carolina to be disposed at the discretion of my Execu-
tors hereafter named. Item I do give devise & bequeath to the minister or
Rector for the time being of the parish of St. Phillips Charles Town the sum of twenty
pounds Curr^{ent} money of Carolina. Item All the real residue of my estate of land
or nature is now or hereafter lying or being I do give devise & bequeath unto my
loving brother Mr William Fullerton (living in the Shire of Ayr in the
west of Scotland his Executors Administrators assigns forever. Item I do hereby
nominate & appoint my loving friends William Rhett of Charles Town
Merchant Sarah his wife to be my Executors of this my last will & testament & do
hereby by these presents revoke renounce frustrate & make void all former will &
testaments hitherto made & do hereby declare & appoint this to be my last
will & testament this eighth day of October in the seventh year of the Reigne
of our Sovereign Lady Ann by the Grace of God of Great Brittain France
& Ireland Queen Defender of the faith &c. & in the year of our Lord God
one thousand seven hundred & eight
Signe sealed publish & declared by the
above named George Fullarton to be his
last will & testament in presence of us
Century Locke Mary Pearce Sarah Locke.
