and merciful preservation. After wherefore I do desire and command
my testaments. I heartily say. I have nowe very little left in this world
and the other shalbe at your service. I say. I have nowe
had and served my God almighty to the best of my power
and the clearest layes. And in my last will and testament I do
make and declare^t my last will and testament to be executed. I do also make this
my last will and testament in the tenth year of my reign as aforesaid in the
Year of our Lord M^r William the Third. I do also make this my last will and testament.

¶ I South Carolina. In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Painter of
No 2 Brinkley County in Province before me testifying, was very sick
& weak in body but of sound mind memory & reason to Almighty
God for the same & also considering the uncertainty of this mortality by
to make and confirm this my last will & testament in manner & form
following. First. I bequeath my soul unto the hands of my Redeemer
Jesus Christ hoping through his grace & merits for salvation & judgment
of my soul, and my body I commit to the earth a temporally buried
at the discretion of my Executor hereafter mentioned in full hopes of a
joyfull resurrection at the last day and to my estate wh^t it hath
pleased God to bestow upon me in this world I do give and dispose
of the same affolloweth. I purpose I write that my just debts &
official expenses shall be first paid and discharged and that my
personall estate be afforthwith sold in order thereto. Item. I will
(in case my personall estate be not sufficient to pay my just debts and
otherwise) that my real estate be sold also by my Executor hereafter men-
tioned to any person or persons whatsoever willing to purchase of same.
Item. I will that the residue of my Estate after my debts are paid be
divided equally between my loving wife
Mary Painter & my daughter Hannah Painter but in case my daughter
Hannah Painter should die before the age of fifteen years then my will is
that the whole of my said estate descend to my said wife to her heirs and
assignes forever. Lastly I do nominate & appoint my loving wife
Mary Painter sole Execut^r of this my last will and testament revoking all

all former & other wills or wills by me heretofore made. I declare & witness
this writing to be my last will & testament. Testimoniis whereof testator
hancit sette my hand & seal in Charles Towne in South
Carolina this twenty second day of August in the year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and nine.

lowing that whereas I purpose have my soul into the hands of Almighty God
hoping through the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ forgiveness of all my sins
and my body I commit to Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executor
hereafter named and of my worldly goods I do give as follows (my just debts
and funeral charges being first paid and satisfied). First. I give devise
and bequeath unto my loving friend George Took late of London Gent^r all
that my Schooner named George now lying at an anchor in the harbor of
Charles Towne together with all her mast yards sails anchors cables
rigging and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging to the
only use and behoof of him the said George Took his heirs and assigns
forever. Item. I give and bequeath all the rest and residue of my
Estate both real & personall whatsoever the same is to be found unto
my dearly beloved wife Elizabeth Troy and to my son Thomas Troy equally
to be divided between them share and share alike. And my will is that
all such part of my Estate whether real or personall that shall be left
for my said son Thomas when a dividend thereof is made shall be
used and employed by my said wife in aid for his maintenance and
education until he attain his age of twenty one years. And in case
my said wife Elizabeth shall happen to die before my said son Thomas
