be raised by such sale or disposition in y^e first place pay & reimburse
himself all such sum & sumes of money wha he owes w^{ch} I ally^e time
of my decease Shall any wayes owe or be justly indebted unto him y^e
Cousen Hambury Walthall together with all such sum or sumes of money
whatsoever that he shall expend or lay out either in suits or suites
in law or Equity in gaining possession of the said p^rmitte after w^{ch}
debt fully paid satisfied in case there should be any overplus remain
ing then that he y^e Cousen Hambury Walthall shall either pay or distribute
into such workes to and amongst such of my relations (or ther
with to pay such of my debts) as he shall think fitt. Item, Likewise
give and bequeath unto my^r Cousen Hambury Walthall all such good
debts wherunto I am indebted by accountings wages profits sum & sumes of
money & other my personall estate whatsoever, wherof I shall dye
possessed and w^{ch} all y^e time of my decease shall any wise be due, pay
able, owing or belonging to me y^e Cousen Hambury And I doe make
ordaine constitute & appoint y^e Cousen Hambury Walthall Exor of this my
last will & Testament hereby revoking all former wills & Testaments by
me made & declaring this to be my last will & Testament. In witness
whereof I the Cousen Hambury have hereunto set to my hand and seal
the one and twentieth day of October Anno: Dni 1596 And in y^e eight
year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord William the third by the
Grace of God King of England Scotland France & Ireland Defender
of the faith — And John Hambury signed sealed published
& declared by the Cousen Hambury as for his last will & Testament

Item I Give and bequeath all the rest and residue of my Estate both realt & personall wheresoever the same is to be found unto my dearly belov'd wife Elizabeth Fry and to my son Thomas Fry equally to be divid'd between them share and share alike. And my wills that all such part of my Estate wheather real or personall that shall be allotted for my said son Thomas when a dividend thereof is made shall be used and employed by my said wife as want for his maintenance and education until he attain his age of twenty one years. And I Give my said wife Elizabeth shall happen today before my said son Thomas
