Sixty Eight.

Sixty Eight. Name of God Amen. I Richard Baker of this Province Esq being sick of body but of sound mind & perfect memory minded to be to Almighty God for ye same & knowing y^e quality of the mortal life to make this my last will & testament in manner & form following. Imprimis I bid and beseeche myself to God my Creator and my body to y^e ground from whence it was taken there to be interred without stain mankin & as far as Estimable estate it hath pleased God to endow me with in this Province from thymath in manner following. I give to my son Edward the sum of one hundred & twenty five pounds to his wife Mary Hawkins also to my daughter Anne the sum of one hundred & twenty five pounds Little Abraham & the Church in my Son's name I give Elizabeth his then Chidren & husband & to my son Edward the sum of one hundred & twenty five pounds to my daughter Mary Baker his wife daughter of my son Edward & my wife Mary Baker his wife said two hundred & twenty five pounds to my son Edward & his wife Mary Baker his wife the sum of one hundred & twenty five pounds to my son Edward & his wife Elizabeth his wife which shall be divided among them in equal parts head of cattle which shall be sold to be divided among those my son Edward left me & his family head of cattle to my son the Baker three of y^e mares to my son Edward & to him & his wife to be divided the whole stock of sheep to be equally divided amongst my children. I desire honest man for y^e plantation use & give to my son y^e Hutchinson to wherein he is now settled said son Hutchinson to come upon my land Wm. Gaultier & his son & wife to my son Peter Baker. I give to my son Peter Baker & his wife the sum of one hundred & twenty five pounds to his wife law & customaries to my son in case of my death his wife to be divided among his wife & his daughters. I give to my son John Baker & his wife the sum of one hundred & twenty five pounds to his wife law & customaries to my son John Baker & his wife to be divided among his wife & his daughters part of my cattle to y^e plantation use. I do hereby also nominate Francis Herbert my son Edward Baker & his wife Executrix of this my last will & testament disallowing all other wills or testaments by me or in my name made ratifying & confirming this my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have set my hand & seal to my said estate this twenty eighth day of January anno domini 1898.

No 28 Carolina p. Comt^t Berkley. In the name of God Amen. I John Johns late of the City of London before now of Charles Town in the County & Province above being sick in body but of sound & perfect strength of memory thank God Almighty God do leave this my Codicil to the last will & testament which I left behind me in England to Iepinis. My will is that my Executrix mentioned in the my codicil do pay all my debts which I owe in Carolina & my funeral expenses there. I give & bequeath to George Logan Esq & Capt William Smith Doctor two of my creditors of this no codicil for their trouble ten pounds each of them in Carolina money. Also all y^e residue owing estate in Carolina after my debts & funeral expenses & legacies is discharged. I give to my beloved wife Frances my Doctor the sum of two hundred pounds to be equally divided between them both my wife is year of age resident in Carolina (city) Geo Logan Esq & Capt William Smith do leave all of sum to them in England or otherwise as they shall direct. Also I give & bequeath to my wife Frances Johns all that dividend which shall belong to her of my estate in Carolina. Likewise to her during her natural life or time of widowhood and after her decease or marriage take to be equally divided between my two daughters Mary & Elizabeth Johns to hold to the last day before their birth their house & assignes forever. Sixty Six & a half shillings Francis Johns Esq & my partner Mr John Hawkins & George Logan & Capt William Smith Executors to the my Codicil. And whereas my brother Edmund Johns deceased did leave me y^e sum of twenty pounds to be paid out of my estate in Carolina before directed his fellowshipp ten pounds to his wife Mary Johns, two pounds to his own mother Elizabeth Johns & five pounds to his widow in case this should occur then my two Executrix residing in Carolina to get sum & send the money home. In witness whereof I the said John Johns have hereunto set my hand & seal & declare this to be my Codicil to y^e last will & testament left in London this eighth day of October anno domini 1898. Signed read published and declared in the presence of

Before sealing - And whereas I have in my hands twenty pounds of Mr Francis Gray's goods sold me, my will desirous is that my two Executrix residing here do remitting same to him out of my estate before divided.
