my only Saviour & Redemer for Eternal life, my body to be decently and  
Christianly buried by my Executors whom I appoint to be Christopher Williams  
Andrew Allane William Hickins and Archibald Stobo to see this my  
last will and testament punctually fulfilled as in manner and form  
following. I give my will to have all my just and lawful debts  
be paid after my death. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife  
nichitable Gilbertson the third part of my negroes & Indian slaves Gods  
chattels to her for her own proper use & service. Item I give and bequeath  
to my beloved & only daughter Nancy Gilbertson the whole tract of land  
now lying upon and to be possessed of lying on the North side of Leathers  
Lawnes to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my  
aforesaid daughter her and her heirs forever my three Parcels of Lands in Hanes  
Town plot, where the houses and plantations thereto belonging  
also give and bequeath to my aforesaid daughter the two thirds of all my  
negroes and Indian slaves goods chattels instruments etc possessed off.  
but and yet it should please God that my aforesaid daughter should die  
before the shall come to age I have taught her by her own body then  
my will is that all her inheritance go to my will together when  
she is she is dead. Item I give and bequeath to my sister in law  
Mary McMurtry that having been call to me lying upon a little  
rock commonly called Pinelikest tree in Hanes Town plot. Item I give  
and bequeath to the McMurtry trustees sum of fifteen shillings per pound to buy  
a piece of silver plate in the common market. Item My will is that my  
molate woman Ruth Stobbe be free immediately after my decease take my  
will is that her three female children Betty, Sally and Nelly shall be put  
at the age of one and twenty years my will is also that Ruth shall have  
the feather bed in the summer bed with an iron pot and her maintenance  
upon my plantation during her natural life. Item My will is that my  
Indian man Cyrus shall have my cattle until he makes upon the plan-  
tation for his own proper use during his natural life. Item I give and be-  
queath unto my brother David Lee now in England a tract of land con-  
taining five hundred acres to him and his heirs forever lying upon the  
north branch of Tugedoe creek. Item I give and bequeath to my pre-  
mentioned Executors each of them five pounds a year to be my respects  
to them. Item I give and bequeath to my minister Mr. Archibald Stobo as  
a token of my love to him the sum of twenty pounds disannulling all  
former wills by me made. I constitute & appoint this to be my last will  
testament as witness my hand seal this sixteenth day of August seventeen  
hundred & seventy before these witnesses

of August God sayeth and each of them say that they and each of them was  
present and did see James Gilbertson the testator above mentioned sign and

last will & testament and that at the same time the said testator James  
Gilbertson was of sound and disposing mind memory.

W. J. South Carolina. In the Name of God, Amen! I John Mc Murray  
Minist<sup>r</sup> of the Gospel at Kainhou in the Province aforesaid being of per-  
fect health and of sound mind & memory ( Praised be God) do make  
this my last will and testament in manner & form following hunc  
revising all wills & testaments by me formerly made and executed. I  
conmit my soul to God & give it and my body to the Earth to be  
decently interred according to the directions of my Executors hereafter named  
in hope of a blessed resurrection through Jesus Christ my only Lord &  
Redemer. And as to the disposition of my worldly Estate my will and  
mind is that all my goods and chattels whatsoever be sold for the de-  
paying my just debts and funeral charges and that all the residue and  
relicions part of my estate after my said debts are fully discharged  
shall be disposed of and managed by my Execut<sup>r</sup> hereafter named  
to the best advantage according to their judgment for the sole use &  
benefit of my beloved daughter Mary Mc Murray. I will & bequeath  
my whole Estate real and personal in the Province aforesaid overhove  
to my said daughter Mary Mc Murray to her heirs forever. Sale will  
and appoint that my said daughter be sent with all possible expedition  
after my decease w<sup>t</sup> all my effects whatsoever to her grandfather Mr  
Robert Porter living in Bell-Russell near Bell-Post in the Kingdom  
of Ireland and do order and appoint that the said Mr Robert Porter at  
the arrival of my said daughter in Ireland shall take into his care and  
possession my said daughter and my effects w<sup>t</sup> her for the duration  
and behoof of my said daughter until she shall arrive at the age  
of sixteen years or until the day of marriage and it is my will that we  
as the said Robert Porter do depart this life before my said daughter  
shall come to the age of sixteen years or contract matrimony then my  
will is that Mr Robert Porter the son of the aforesaid Robert Porter shall  
take and hereby ordered to take the whole care and trust of my said  
daughter and all my effects for the sole use and benefit of my said daughter  
under the limitations and restrictions aforesaid. And in memory of my

should die before she arrives at the age aforesaid or before the contract matrimonial  
is executed and give all my Estate real & personal unto my beloved Sister Jane Mc-  
Murtry living near Drummore in the County of Down in the Kingdom  
of Ireland to her heirs forever And I do order and appoint that my Executors  
hereafter named take special care that my said effects be transmitted to my  
Sister in case of my daughter's death as aforesaid. I give and bequeath to my  
well beloved wife Mary McMurtry a gold ring of value twenty shillings Sterling  
whichever comes down in her of all manner of claim to any part of my  
Estate real or personal debts dues or demands whatsoever this being  
present to a verbal contract agreed upon between us both and was actually  
executed on the part of my said wife before marriage. Wherefore it is my  
real intent & meaning notwithstanding any custom or usage to the contrary  
that my said wife shall be excluded & shall be excluded from every part  
share and thing belonging or appertaining to my Estate real or personal all  
afforded except a gold ring of the value aforesaid. Lastly. I nominate & ap-  
point Capt Robert Brewton & Michael Darby & Mr Jeremiah Russell to  
be Execut. in trust for my daughter Mary McMurtry. In testimony where-

No 38 in the Province of South Carolina do make & ordain my last will and testament in manner and form following (that is  
to say) first and principally I commend my soul unto the hands of All  
mighty God hoping through the satisfaction and merit of my only Saviour  
and dear Redeemer Jesus Christ to have full and free pardon of all my sins  
and to inherit Everlasting life my body I commit to the Earth to be decently  
buried at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named and my tomb  
being such temporal estate as it hath pleased God of his infinite mercy to  
bestow upon me I give and dispose thereof as followeth. I give & I will that all

all my just debts and funeral expenses be first paid & discharged. Then  
give and bequeath to my loving daughter Jane Holtbatch the sum of one  
hundred pounds Currant money of Carolina to be paid unto her the twelfth  
month next after my decease. Item All the rest and residue of my Estate  
both real and personal whatsoever and wheresoever I give devise and bequeath  
to my loving wife Jane Holtbatch and to the chilz wherewithal is now  
enclined to them heirs Executors Administrators or assigns forever equally  
divided between them share to share alike but in case my said wife shall  
misarry or the chilz whereby she is now enclined if a boy shall happen  
soe before the age of twenty one years old of marriage then I give the whole  
to my said wife her heirs Execut. Administrators or assigns forever & she  
herself constitute my said wife to be guardian of such chilz as there shall be  
now enclined till it comes to the age of twenty one years or marriage in  
case she so long continue my said widow but in case of my wife's death  
or marriage I appoint my friends Michael Brewton Guardians and Lastly  
I do hereby appoint to nominate the said Michael Brewton full and sole  
Executor of this my last will & testament hereby revoking all former  
and other wills by me at any time heretofore made and do further and  
declare this to be and stand as and for my last will and testament. In witness  
whereof I the said Joseph Holtbatch have hereunto set my hand seal the  
third day of November Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty  
Signed sealed published and declared by the

above named Joseph Holtbatch as and for  
his last will & testament in the presence of
