P.P. In the Name of God Amen, I, John Moore, of Charles Town in the
Province of South Carolina Doctor some or most perfect and sound memory
praised be Almighty God do make and ordain this my last will and
testament in manner and form following that it may be known: - In presence
of whom my love to the one and in relation of Almighty God his
Divinity remanded by me to my just & dear wife Mary Cramer his
First Testator full power and authority over my lands and to manage
lasting her undying love I will & desire to be decently buried.
Item: Regard is had my use to pay and remove charges that be first
paid and recovered. Item: I will & desire my beloved wife Mary
Cramer all my Testate both now and hereafter shall receive one negro boy
named Ciprius and his negro woman named Sue and two said
other chattels in what nature or kind soever I now possessed of to take
for her use so long as she shall live. Item: I give to my
wife and request unto my loving wife Mary Cramer all that part
and remaining time yett remaine unexpired at the lease of the house and
land which I hold at Richard Edens in New London to have for
her use of please God she shall stayng ther. Item: my feather will
to that ift shall please God to recall my loving wife Mary Cramer
with a long and tedious sickness lossy of limb accident by fire
or any other unexpected misfortune that so the use above mentioned
are not sufficient to support her wants necessities that then and
in such case by and w^t the advice and consent of my Executors
hereinafter named that any part of the above mentioned estate
shall and may be disposed of toward towards the support and
maintenance of her shall remain a widow, but unless
she shall marry then to hold and receive the uses after above mentioned
and nothing more. And I do by these presents make ordain nominate
and appoint my loving friends Thomas French and Richard French
my Executors to this my last will and testamens and lastly

me

my will is after the decease of my loving wife Mary Cramer, to sell all
the余ing part and parcel of the remaining and residue of the above men-
tioned estate all just debts and funeral expences first being paid and
discharged shall be disposed of by my above named Executors to
such charitable uses as they shall think fit and approve of, and
I do by these presents renounce revoke and declare to make void all
former wills and testaments by me heretofore made. In witness
whereof set my hand and seal the twenty fifth day September anno
Domⁱ 1770.

Patrick Ballantine

In the Name of God Amen, the fifteenth day of September in the year
of our Lord 1720: I Patrick Ballantine of Charles Town South Carolina
in the County of Berkeley Esquire being very sick and weak in body but
of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God therefore calling unto
mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all
men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament
that is to say Principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into
the hands of God that gave it and my body I recommend to the Earth to be
buried in a Christian like decent manner at the discretion of my Executors
nothing doubting butt at the General resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wher-
ewith itt hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and leave
of the same in the following manner & form: - In presence I give and bequeath
to Catharine Haucken my grandchild thirty foot front of my lot that is at
White Point under the shop that on its w^t the debt of the said lot to be and
her heirs for ever. Item: I give to my well beloved son John Ballantine one
half of the remaining part of the said lot and one half of my dwelling
house upon one lot of ground that is in Providence and a small tract of land
