Carolina p. In the Name of God Amen. I John Tansusterson of ye Province of Carolina Marchant although sick and weak in body yet of good spirit and sound memory thanks be to God therefore doe make this my last will & testament. First I commend my soule to ye mercy of God that gave it and my body I comitt to the Earth to be buried in such place and with such charges as my Executors or Administrators in this behalfes shall thinke fitt and for ye worldly estate which God hath blessed me with I desire of ye same in manner forme following. I doe give grant demise and bequeath to my beloved wife Perina Rabbits one full moiety or halfe part of all and singular my real & personall estate whoesoever I have to hold of ye said full moiety or halfe part of my said real & personall estate in ye severall part of ye world of ye same is or shall be unto my said wife Perina Rabbits her heires and assigns forever. Item I doe give grant demise and bequeath to my two daughters Wille Tansusterson & Elizabeth Tansusterson of other full moiety or halfe part of all & singular my real & personall estate whatsoever to be equally divided betwix them. I have to hold of ye said full moiety or halfe part of my said real & personall estate whatsoever in ye world of ye same is or shall be unto my said two daughters Wille and Elizabeth thaire & every of thaire thaire assignes forever ye same to be divided in even and equal portions and paid them at ye age of twenty one years or dayes of marriage which shall first happen. Item by will is that my said wife shall have ye education & bringing up of my said two daughters & that in case either of them shall happen to dye before ye age of twenty one years before thaire marriage, that thaire aires in such case of ye share or portion of her soe dying shall be and remaine to ye survivor of them. Item I doe make & ordaine my said wife Perina Rabbits my sole Executrix of this my last will & testament hereby giving and granting unto my said Executrix full power & authority to bargain sell alien and assigne over unto any person or persons whatsoever all & singular my lands, houses, tenements, goods, Chattels and every of them in Carolina or elsewhere, wth thaire and every of thaire appurtenances, and for such summe or summes of money and for such estates or otherwaies as to my said Executrix shall be thought fitt. The effects or produce thereof to be for the use of my said Executrix & my two daughters as aforesaid. Item I doe make my Executrix in ye Island of Barbadoes of ye same to suffer for want of one to manage of ye same.

& William Miles y^e son of Anthony Miles deceased now both living

upon Edisto Island all my goods and Chatters and I doe nominate
Henry Devere & William Miles to be my whole sole Ex^{ors} of this my last will
and testame^{nt}. Sealed with my seal the thirtieth day of October 1793
in y^e fifth year of Steu^r Majesty's reign King Will^m & Queen Mary on
England &c. Anno Domⁱ 1793.

make and ordain this my last will and testame^{nt}. That is to say
Principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into
the hands of God that gave it, and for my body I recommend it to
the Earth to be buried in a Christian manner at y^e discretion of my
loved and dearly beloved wife Elizabeth Matthews whom I con-
-stitute make and ordain my only and sole Executrix of this my
last will & testame^{nt} and to whom I give and bequeath and to her
heirs forever all my household goods moveables and other estate of
what condition sever whether real or personal by her and heirs
aforesaid freely to be possessed forever. And I do hereby utterly dis-
-allow revoke and disannull all and every other former testame^{nt}
wills legacies requests Executors & Executrices by me or any of y^e
before this time named willed and bequeathed & ratify
confirming this and noe other to be my last will and
