1730³¹ Charles Town in South Carolina This fourth week day of October.
 I Isaac Redwood Victuals
 being such weak in body but of sound & perfect mind & memory do make ordain & publish
 declare these presents to be containe my last will & testament. I ^{give} bequeath
 unto my daughter Anne Frances Redwood all that messuage or tenement which lies in
 Charles Town upon y^e eighth part of a lot distinguished by y^e n^o twenty seven as also y^e said
 eighth part of y^e lot to be equally divided betwixt my said daughters. Item I give bequeath
 unto my said two daughters all my household goods furniture and wearing apparell to be equally
 divided between them. Item I give bequeath unto my said two daughters all that manner
 of other goods & tenements belonging to me save & other my estate both real & personall to be share
 I have like. Item My will & pleasure is that my Executors here after named do sell
 & dispose of all my formentioned real & personall estate for y^e education & bringing
 up of my said daughters if they stay in this Province & if they shall by any means go
 into England y^e said Estate to be for both their uses as for their passage to & her returne
 y^e & what shall remain over to be equally share to be sent home with them to be equally
 divided between them. Lastly I do hereby nominate & appoint Mr. Francis Smith
 Thomas Marshall my whole sole Executors & do hereby give him attorney of five pounds
 for his trouble in seeing this my last will performed. In testimony whereof I have
