Isaac Cleddwood

My Will & Testament in the presence of John Valentine & Joseph Gibbons
Town Marin^t being sick & ready to die I do make this my last will & testam't.
First I recommend my soul to my Maker & desire his grace of mercy.
I wish that my effects worth my estate to be divided amongst my children in the following manner
to be equally divided by lot among my daughters according to their respective ages.
My eldest daughter Margaret shall have my house where I now live
silver plate & two tables, the one white & the other unpolished because I have lost one in my
buckboard standing in Broad Street next to the river severn. Also I give my youngest child
my serving brother Dan Hoskings & sons two houses and money out of my service & apparel.
Also I give the greatest number of my slaves & servants & household goods & money
and my jewels & pieces of jewelry to Charles Towne my son & if he should then
promise to let me have a house & some servants & a yearly income of my wife & child
one third part & all the rest of my household goods & estate in share & lot with his son
to have & hold of him for his reasonable maintenance. Also I give my slaves & servants
unto my only son Dan Hoskings & his descendants of either sex three hundred & twenty
of remainder of my said real & personal estate to my Servants or Servantes or him myself
Son Dan Hoskings except. Subject to happen that my son Dan has begun to encroach upon
my estate in Boston to my brother Dan Hoskings & his wife Elizabeth Hoskings &
myself Elizabeth Hoskings & her three last mentioned sons of Island or Sommerset
my two third parts & all remainder of remainder going to Dan Hoskings estate to be equally
divided amongst them & their respective heirs & assigns. Lastly I nominate & appoint
my loving wife Margaret Hoskings my loving brother Dan Hoskings & his son Capt. Thomas
Smith Executors in case of death of either of them Dan Hoskings & his son Capt. Thomas
I do hereby nominate & appoint my brother Capt. James Hoskings to serve him that does not & all
desiring them to see of due execution of this my last will & testam't hereby making null & void
all former other wills by me made & declared. In witness whereof I have caused to be my
hand sealed & declared in the presence of
Robert Lang Jr. Ingerson. Edward Marston.

Memoirandum Mr Nathaniel Snow Chirurgeon Thomas Boies William Weston
Plauters & Margaret Hayes Spinster all of Berkley County were at request of Mr
Robert Weatherick late of New England then of Somerton my County paid called
into my room where said Weatherick lay at & hour of said Snow deceased and Weatherick
last will & testam't which he qd said Weatherick did declare publicly w^t premises
allegis in y^e following words viz That he qd said Weatherick did give all the chattels w^t his
world after his debts paid which particularly remained to be owing to Mr Lewis
Pasqueau about forty shill to Mr James De Rose an uncertain sum & qd
Nathaniel Snow his charge for burying of him his medicines trouble death & all other
y^e said Margaret ten shill to his wife except his wearing apparel which he
gave between her two sons the shoe buckles taken off his son also that he desired of said
Snow to bury him decently as he should think convenient in his y^e said Snow plantation
within y^e fence thereof. And that this was done by qd said Weatherick then in his bed
except twice on thursday morning last about four o'clock being y^e fifth day of Sept.
hearing in hearing of us whose names are underwritten.

Andrew Penruddock

In the name of God Amen I Andrew Penruddock of Westminister in y^e County
of Middlesex being infirm of body but to sound mind & understanding thanks be
to God to make during my last will & testam't reciting all former wills by me made.
In witness I render unto y^e hand of Almighty God my body to be decently buried
in y^e vault of y^e chappel thereafter named. Item I give to my dear wife Mrs
Penruddock & her son Samuel Penruddock all the money goods chattels & estate real
& personal I have in England (except my Jewells plate & household goods) interest & purpose
that they shall as soon as may be layout of same in purchasing of
lands & houses to be vested in trustees & their heirs in due form of law; so that my said
wife may enjoy of rents & profits thereof to her own use until y^e time of my son Samuel
Penruddock attaining of age of twenty one years in case she shall so long live & from
her decease or y^e time of his attaining of said age of twenty one years which
shall first happen then to y^e use of my said son Andrew his heirs & assigns forever
but yet so that in case my said son Andrew shall attain of said age of twenty one
years leaving my said wife, then that of said Estate shall be charged with
y^e yearly value of One hundred pounds which I give & devise to be paid to my said
wife by quarterly pay w^t from y^e time he shall attain of said age during
her natural life without any deduction or abatement for taxes or otherwise.
Item I give & devise all my lands & houses & hereditaments to all my goods chattels
all my estate real & personal whatsoever which I have in Carolina or else-
where in America to my said son Andrew Penruddock to y^e use of his heirs
