Memorandum Mr Nathaniel Snow Surgeon, Thomas Bosier, William Weston, Charles & Margaret Hynes, Spinster, all of Berkley County, were at y^e request of Mr Robert Weatherick late of New England, then of Connetquot, my^e County of Essex called into y^e room where said Weatherick lay at y^e house of said Snow to hear y^e said Weatherick's last will & testament which he y^e said Weatherick did declare & publish in y^e presence of all us y^e following words viz: That he y^e said Weatherick did give all his said wife's world (as far as he had to pay) which particularly he named to be owing to Mr Lewis Pasquereau about forty Shill. to Mr James De Rose an uncertain sum y^e said Nathaniel Snow his charges for burying of him, his medicines & trouble & death still living y^e said Margaret ten Shill^{cs} to his wife except his wearing apparel which he gave before he was dead & his three buckles to his eldest son, and that he desired y^e said Snow to bury him decently as he should think convenient in his y^e said plantation within y^e space thereof. And that this was done by y^e said Weatherick then in his own & perfect senses on Thursday morning last about four o'clock being y^e fifth day of y^e month of September y^e minute Anno 1790. 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In the Name of God Amen I, Andrew Bosier of Westminster in y^e County of Middlesex being informed of my body but of sound mind & understanding thanks be to God do make this my last will & testament touching all former wills & testament hereby made. I bequeath & devise my soul into y^e hands of Almighty God my body to be decently buried & my soul to rest in peace hereafter named. I then I give to my dear wife Elizabeth Bosier all the money goods & chattels & estate real & personal I have in England (except my jewels plate & household goods) in trust y^e intent & purpose that they shall as soon as may be lay out y^e same in y^e purchasing of lands & tenements to be vested in trustees their heirs & assigns forever; so that my said wife may enjoy y^e rents & profits thereof to her own use untill y^e time of my son Andrew Bosier's attaining y^e age of twenty years & thereafter she shall so long live & from y^e time her decease or y^e time of his attaining y^e said age of twenty years which shall first happen then y^e use of my said son Andrew his heirs & assigns forever but yet so that in case my said son Andrew shall attain y^e said age of twenty years, leaving my said wife, then that y^e said estate shall be charged with y^e yearly sum of one hundred pounds which I give & devise to be paid to my said wife by quarterly paym^{ts} from y^e time he shall attain y^e said age during her natural life without any deduction or abatement for taxes or other such. I then I give & devise all my lands Tenements & hereditaments & all my goods & chattels & all my estate real & personal whatsoever which I have in England or elsewhere where in America to my said Cousin Samuel Bosier & my dear wife Elizabeth
