to my wife Mary Ann Henry one round Cow. Item. I give to my wives
Catherin Hester one round Cow. Item. I give to my husband Thomas
Hester Junr. one cow & calf and one mule. Item. I give to my sister Dorothy
one horse and saddle. Item. I give my brother Abraham Chapman one
gold ring of two dollars value one year after my decease. Item. I give my
Brother Abraham Smith one to & one of his hounds price one year
after my decease. Item. I give my Brother Jacob Livingston twenty pounds
to be paid him when he reaches his majority. Item. I give my sister Elizabeth
Wright my old saddle & bridle & saddle. Item. I give my brother Isaac
Wright my young horse. Item. I give my brother Isaac Wright my
saddle pistols carbine and a set of things belonging to them.
Item. I give all the rest of my horses & cattle to be equally divided as

Morton of the Province of Carolina Landgrave being in perfect health and of
sound mind and memory praised be God but being deeply sensible of the
uncertainty of this transitory life do make and declare this my last will
and testament in manner and forme following that is to say first
I will that all such debts as I shall truly owe at my decease shall
be paid according to Equity and good Conscience and all the residue of
my Estate (negroes cattle, horses, sheep, hogs, lands, tenements,
hereditaments all goods and chattels to me belonging whatsoever
after my debts paid discharged. Item. I give will & devise in
bequeath as followeth that is to say first. I give and bequeath unto
my niece Florence Beamer the daughter of my sister, one hundred
pounds current money of Carolina to be paid unto her the day of my
death, over the age of twenty one years. Item I do give grant devise
and bequeath to my loving wife Sarah Morton one full moiety or half
part of all & singular my real & personal Estate whatsoever not already
by this will bequeathed to have and to hold by said full moiety or half
part of my said real & personal estate in whatsoever part of the world
the same is or shall be unto my said wife Sarah Morton her heirs &
Assigns forever except my lands which after her decease shall go to my
son. Item. I do give, will, grant, devise and bequeath to my
son Joseph Morton the other full moiety or half part of all and
singular my real and personal estate whatsoever not already by this
will bequeathed to have and to hold the said other full moiety or
half part of my said real and personal estate in whatsoever part
of the world the same is or shall be unto my said son Joseph
Morton his heirs & assigns forever. Item. my will is that in case
my son Jos. Morton happens to die before he comes to age or to have
kings of his body then I give grant devise & bequeath all my estate
both real & personal whatsoever unto my beloved wife Sarah Mor-
ton her heirs & assigns forever, or to dispose and give as she thinks
best and my will is that my Estate be well improved and my
son Joseph Morton to have half the improvements after my wife
Jos. Morton is well maintained out of it, and my desire is that
my son Joseph Morton have the best education in the Country.
Lastly I do make and ordain my beloved wife Sarah Morton shall Exec-
utor of this my last will and testament requiring my said Executrix
to see the same well performed and I do utterly revoke all former

I further I give and bequeath unto Mary Wyatt my loving wife all my estate both real and personal left to me in my receipt whatsoever In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirteenth day of November 1721 in the fifth year of the Reign of his Majestie King George the third and of his term wills by me made declaring this to be my last will and testament.

I imprie I will that all my just debts & funeral expenses be first paid and discharged and that what so ever unto me Stephen Godwin of London Merchant be paid unto him in London by the Alard Belin of London Merchant out of what shall be remitted to him by my Executors according to my directions hereinafter mentioned. Item. It is my mind & Will and I do hereby ordene and appoint that my Executors hereinafter named and y: survivor^{es} of them within ten days after my decease or soon after as may be to sell convey & dispose off to y: highest bidder and his heirs and assigns forever all and every my lands tenements moneys and hereditaments within this Province to be paid in Rece y: one half the net crop after my decease & y: other half y: crop ensuing. Item I give and bequeath all such sum and sums of money as shall arise by sale of my lands and hereditaments as aforesaid and all and singular my whole personal Estate whatsoever and wheresoever unto my loving wife Mary Pasquereau & my loving son and daughter John and Mary Magdalene their Execs and Admrs forever equally to be divided between them share & share alike. Item my mind and will is that my said Execs do remitt and send y: produce of all my whole Estate both real & personal unto y: said Alard Belin upon y: proper account and risque of my said wife & son and daughter. Item. It is my mind & will that my said wife removes with her self and her said two children from St Thomas's to St Christopher's and there resides at them and not return agen to St Thomas's and in mind and willis that in case of her sepa rate or neglecting to do upon notice of this my desire by my Execs or y: s: Alard Belin then her part and interest of
