in South Carolina Widd: taking into consideration the frailty and
Necessity of human nature that is appointed for all men once to
die, for the future good and quiet of my family, and to lay all com-
-ests of may hereafter arise concerning my Affairs, do substitute
and make this my last will and Testament in witness and of firm
follow (say) I Impriumal wick humbly resign my soul into the
hands of God in hopes of mercy thro' the merits of Jesus Christ my
only Saviour and Redeemer. I do Commit & bequeath my body to
the Earth from whence it came requiring only that my Executors
hereafter to be named may inter the same decently according to
their discretion. I do also my present self on hand, give and
bequeath unto my son James Daniel the sum of fifty
pounds of my present money of the said Province with some of money I re-
-quire of my Executors may be an allowance of miltill he shall
be twenty one years old or some other Executors see cause. I do
give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Bedow all the remain-
-ing part of my present money to be paid her when she shall be of full
-age to be delivered and payed to her by my Executors at such time as
my said daughter shall come to age and my brother and I that
my said daughter be committed to the sea and to be kept by my
beloved friends the said James Daniel and the said Barker as knoweth
hereby being executor, assignee and trustee my sole Executors
of John my last will and Testament at the same made receiving
all former debts due and to be paid and discharging this only
to be my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this 17 day of April 1731.

Memorandum On the 20 day of April 1731 Personally came and

of the witnesses to the within written will who being duly sworn
on the Holy Evangelists declared that they were personally present
and did see the within testat: Mary Barker sign seal publish
and declare the within Testament of writing to be her last will
and Testament and at the time of her doing thereof she was of
sound mind and memory to the best of their knowledg: and that
they did likewise see the William Shepley the other witness sub-
-scribe his name as an evidence thereunto. Sworn to before me.

Daniel Callahan's last will and Testament (vide Bundle A. D. 1731)
In the Name of God Amen I Daniel Callahan of Callahan County
and Province of South Carolina being sick and weak of body but of sound
N 34 and perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of this
transitory life do make and declare this to be my last will and Testament in
manner and form following hereby revoking all other wills and Testa-
-ments by me heretofore made and acknowledging this and no other
to be my last will and Testament. That is to say. First and prin-
-cipally I will and bequeath my soul to God who gave it me hoping
through his mercies and the merits of my blessed Lord and Saviour
Jesus Christ to obtain remission of all my sins and my body I commit
to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors here-
-after named & as for worldly estate God in his mercy has been pleased
to endow me with I give and dispose thereof as followeth. Imprium
I give bequeath and devise unto my loving son Daniel Callahan
and his heirs and assigns forever four slaves (viz) Paul, Timothy, Peter
Timberick and Charles, to be delivered unto him at the day of his
marriage by my loving wife Honour Callahan, in whose care and
possession I leave the aforesaid slaves till the marriage of my said
son, but in case my said loving wife Honour Callahan should
die before the marriage of my said son then my will is that the
said four slaves be immediately taken into possession of my said
son Daniel Callahan or his heirs or assigns. And further my will
and pleasure is that my son after his marriage shall find and
allow unto my loving wife Honour Callahan a sufficient main-
-tenance during the term of her natural life. Secondly. I will
and bequeath unto my loving son Daniel Callahan and his heirs
and assigns forever my biggest iron pot. Steu. I will and be-
-queath unto my loving daughter Honour Burroughs and her heirs
and assigns forever thirty pounds current money to be paid as
soon as ever my other lawfull debts are paid off. Terts
And further my will and meaning is, that if my son Daniel
should die without issue lawfully begotten of his body that all
my estate real and personal be equally divided between my two
daughters Mary Bedow and Honour Burroughs their heirs or assigns
Steu. I give and bequeath unto my loving son Daniel Callahan
and his heirs and assigns forever two lots in the Town of Beaufort
upon Port Royal Island which also in default of issue are to
revert to my two daughters above named their heirs or assigns.
All the rest of my estate both real and personal I give and bequeath
unto my loving wife Honour Callahan during her natural life
Lastly. I will and appoint my loving son in law Stephen Bedow and
my worthy friend Capt: John Raven whole and sole Executors of this
my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto
put my hand and seal this 17 day of April Anno 1731.
