A. A. Doctor Killpatrick's will (Recd. Binette A.C. 1724) - In the Name
of God Amen. I David Killpatrick of Beaufort County in the Province of
South Carolina Surgeon being sick and weak of body but of sound and
disposing mind and memory thanks be to God for the same do make this my
last will and testament in manner following that is to say first and
principally I bequeath my soul to God that gave it and my body to the Earth
to be buried in such Christianlike manner as to my Executors hereinafter
named shall seem fit and as to what worldly estate it hath pleased
God to bless me with disposeth and bequeath the same in manner
and form following vizt Impriores I will that all my just debts
whatso my friends all charged be paid in somwhat time after my decease.
Item my will is that my Executors hereinafter named do in some short
time after my decease make sale and dispose of my plantation which
they sat in together in order for payment of my debts. Item Whereas
I am possessed of a certain plantation about of thirty three acres and
one of a tract of fifteen acres of land which I hold by lease from
Mr. William Hobbs for the term of thirty years which is to continue till
my death being on Hobbs Creek in Beaufort County aforesaid now my will
is that my Executors hereinafter named do permit Mr. Perry my
successor to continue on the same for the space of one whole
year from the time of my decease and to have the use of all
servitude the slaves and cattle servants I shall die possessed of. He
be and I am hereby reserving to my said Execs a full and just part of
the profits arising from the same as my will is that thereout
my execs pay to the said John Perry the sum of one hundred pounds
for his part of the crop and the sum of one hundred pounds for the
building of one score thousands of bricks and building two stables
of twenty four masonry two houses and breaking one well and
washing the two houses aforesaid and plastering & whitewashing
the same and a acre to him all the cattle belonging to the said
John Perry to wage upon the said tract, and also that the said
John Perry have likewise provisions for himself and his family
during the said term out of the profits of the same, and also
all the end of the said term to have ten bushels of corn and ten
bushels of pease. Item My will is that after the expiration of the
term above year as aforesaid my said Execs do sell my four
slaves vizt Peter, Primus, Peggy & Kate, and also sell all my
right to the plantation aforesaid which I hold by virtue of the
said lease and that the monies arising by such sales after
my debts being paid as aforesaid be equally divided between my
loving friends John Perry and Joseph Headman and have
alike. Item I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint
Sam'l Crookshank and Anthony Matthews Merchants of this
my last will as also the sum of one guinea each to buy them
mourning rings. Item I give & bequeath unto my love friend
Killpatrick the sum of one shilling and lastly Thirtynine pounds
and half and make void all former and other wills and codicils
by me heretofore made declaring this only to be my last will.

and seal to the second the sixteenth day of December anno
