

Miles Rivers' last will and testament Amblett to 49
 In the name of God Amen Miles Rivers of Ashley river and of the
 Parish of St Andrews in South Carolina Planter being weak of body but of
 perfect mind memory thanks be given to Almighty God for the same calling
 NO 49 around the mortality of my body and that it is appointed for all men to die

Therefore recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and my
 body to be Christianly buried according to the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named
 and as to the worldly estate goods and chattels God has been pleased to bestow on me with
 (after all my debts and funeral expenses paid and discharged) I give and bequeath the
 same as follows. I give and bequeath unto my dear beloved Son May
 one negro girl named A. L. and one negro boy named A. L. to be delivered
 to my said wife at the time of my decease. Also I give and bequeath unto my said wife
 all the land I had by her together with liberty to dwell in the house and plantation now
 living during the time of her widowhood. I give and bequeath unto my son
 Thomas my dwelling house and plantation and to be held and a negro boy named
 he happens to die and leave no issue then my wife is to be the same should go to the child that
 my said wife is now with in her womb and a negro boy named. I give and
 bequeath all the rest of my estate goods and chattels not herebefore given and bequeathed
 by me in this my last will and testament between my son and son Thomas by my wife
 to have the said parts. I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Thomas
 my executor hereinafter named and of this my last will and
 testament making disavowments and making out of all other former wills and testaments
 before me made. Witness my hand and seal this 10th day of May 1777
 Henry in the 10th year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third
 Sullivan Francis and Edward being present and at the death of me during said 10th day
 Signed sealed published and declared before us the undersigned
 Miles Rivers like his last will testament in the presence of
 Wm Miles Robert C. Warden John Mason and three

17th April 1777. Personally appeared before me the undersigned John Mason and
 Wm Mason three witnesses to the within will and testament of Miles Rivers and they
 being duly sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God declare that on
 and as to the said death before and publish and declare the above testament as
 his last will and testament and that he was then of sound mind understanding to the
 best of their knowledge and that they subscribed their names as witnesses in the
 said testator's presence and at his request.

The last will and testament of George Peterson Amblett to 50
 South Carolina. In the name of God Amen this 10th day of April in the
 year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and seventy seven. I George
 Peterson of South Carolina in Rockley County in the Parish of St John Knight
 being sick and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be
 given to Almighty God for the same do make and ordain this my last will &
 testament in manner and form following that is to say. I give and bequeath
 my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping and assuredly believing by the
 precious death and merits of our blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ to have
 an evermore full pardon and remission of all my sins and my body I commit
 to the Earth from whence it was taken to be decently entred at the discretion of
 my Executors hereinafter named. I do will that all my just debts and
 funeral charges be first paid & discharged. I give and bequeath all the
 remainder of my estate after my debts be paid both real and personal be it of
 what kind and nature soever either in this Province or in any part of the World
 where it may shall be found more special that one tract of land containing
 some hundred and forty five acres situate more or less between the
 Northward to the lands belonging to the Barrony called Matthee to the Eastward
 lands belonging to the Northward on lands belonging to the Northward and being
 wife Elizabeth Peterson and my daughter Elizabeth Peterson to be equally divided
 between them share and share alike to them and their heirs forever. Lastly
 I do hereby nominate and appoint my brother William Flavell to be the true only and sole Executor
 of this my last will and testament making null and void all former wills and
 testaments and bequests by me heretofore made or intended to be made.
 Signed sealed published and declared by the
 testator George Peterson like his last will and
 testament in the presence of Elizabeth Amblett

 his last will and testament now produced to them to be his last will and testament of
 the said George Peterson and that at the same time the said George Peterson
 was of sound mind and disposing mind memory understanding to the best of their
 Dependants judgment and that they these Dependants did personally subscribe their
 names as witnesses in the said testator's presence and at his request.
