and remaining time yett remaine unexpired at the lease of the house and
land which I hold of Richard Edmonson by reason to have for
her use of please God she shall sayng time. Now my further will
is that ift shall please God to recall my loving wife Mary Lyndall
with a long and tedious sickness lossy of limb accident by fire
or any other unexpected misfortune that so the use above mentioned
are not sufficient to support her wants necessities that then and
in such case by and w^t the advice and consent of my Executors
hereinafter named that any part of the above mentioned estate
shall and may be disposed of toward towards the support and
maintenance of her shall remain a widow, but unless
she shall marry then to hold and receive the uses after above mentioned
and nothing more. And I do by these presents make ordain nominate
and appoint my loving friends Thomas French and Richard French
my Executors to this my last will and testamens and lastly

my will is after the decease of my loving wife Mary Lyndall to sell all
the余ing part and parcel of the remaining and residue of the above men
tioned estate all just debts and funeral expences first being paid and
discharged shall be disposed of by my above named Executors to
such charitable uses as they shall think fit and appropiate, and
I do by these presents renounce revoke and declare to make void all
former wills and testaments by me heretofore made. In witness

of our Lord 1720. I Patrick Ballantine of Charles Town South Carolina
in the County of Berkeley Esquire being very sick and weak in body but
of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God therefore calling unto
mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all
men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testamant
that is to say Principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into
the hands of God that gave it and my body I recommend to the Earth to be
buried in a Christian like decent manner at the discretion of my Executors
nothing doubting butt at the General resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wher
with itt hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and leave
of the same in the following manner & form. Impiring I give and bequeath
to Catharine Haucken my grandchild thirty four foot front of my lot that is at
White Point under the shop that on itt w^t the debt of the said lot taken and
her heirs for ever. I give to my well beloved son John Ballantine one
half of the remaining part of the said lot and one half of my dwelling
house upon one lot of ground that is in Providence and a small tract of ground

that is on Park Rowall adjoining to one Richard Hatchard deceased: and an
iron pot & Squetes my son James Ballantine the other half of the aforesaid
said lot and dwelling house on White Point by him freely to be possessed &
surveyed. I do likewise constitute make & ordain my son John and James
Ballantine to be my executors of this my last will and testament: and I hereby attorney
disallow revoke & disannull all and every other former testament with lega-
cied requests and Executors by me in anywise before this time named
willed and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be
my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal the day and year above written.

hundred and twenty Robert Stevens in the Parish of St. Lucie on Goose
Isle in the Province of South Carolina Esq; sonne sick and weak in body
but of perfect and sound mind and memory thank be given unto God
therefore calling unto mind the mortality and knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die I do make and ordain this my last will and Testament
that is to say first and principally I give and recommend my soul into the
hands of God who gave it and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried
in a decent Christian burial in a plain cedar coffin by the side of my
daughter Mariana Stevens late of this Province deceased nothing doubting
but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the
mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate whereto it hath
pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same
in the following manner and forme (that is to say) I give and will that
all my debts and dutys as I owe in right or conscience to any man
or persons whatsoever and likewise my funeral charges be
well and truly contented and paid at the convenient time after my decease
by

by my Executors hereafter named. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
(during her natural life) all my lands and estates Rents &c elsewhere situated
in the County of Berks or in the land purchased from the heirs of Mr Willm R. Bowes
late of Berkswell in the County of Herts plumb and parcel. Item I give and bequeath
to day my beloved wife all my household goods and jewels to beware her hence
forever. Item I will and require that my loving wife Mrs John Stevens
shall provide for and maintain her during her widowhood with necessary provisions
and likewise a negro girl and
house to be sold at her command during the term last of four months.
Item I give and bequeath to my loving kinsman Mr John Threading (now
residing with me) all my estate both real and personal (not already
disposed of in the former part of this will) or natural kind or quality now
but at this time does and at the time of my decease shall belong to me in
the Province of South Carolina to him and his heirs forever. And further
and upon the decease of my loving wife Mary I give and bequeath unto my
said Kinsman Mr John Threading all my aforesaid lands and estates in
Berkshire or elsewhere in the Kingdom of Great Britain to him and his heirs
forever Provided nevertheless that if my said Kinsman Mr John Threading
and his Aunt my loving wife Mary shall jointly and severally sell and
dispose of the said land and Estate in Berkshire he she or they so selling
and disposing of it shall within eighteen months after the settlement of pay
and to be paid to my loving kinsman Mr Joseph Alexander of Edmundsbury in the
County of Suffolk in the Kingdom of Great Britain & Ireland & his heirs assign
the sum of one hundred pounds Sterling money of England. And to her
heirs male and雌女 my said Kinsman Mr John Threading sole and only
executor of this my last will and testament disallowing revoking and disan-
nulling all manner other former testaments legacies and bequests Executed
by me in any way before willed and bequeathed ratifying and con-
firming this and no other to be my last will and testament. In witness
