 my dear & loving wife Mary Brimball my plantation on Edisto Island containing
 one six hundred acres of land her the same more or less with all the houses
 additions & buildings thereto belonging during her natural life. Item After
 my wife's decease I give grant & devise unto my son Thomas Brimball all my
 plantation of six hundred acres apart^d with the buildings thereon I have the
 sold my C^d plantation & buildings thereon to my son Thomas Brimball his
 heirs & assigns forever. Item. My will is if my son Thomas Brimball in
 accidental one of the above plantation & buildings shall pay within one
 year after my wife's death the following sumes six to my daughter
 Hamilton Ten pounds sterl. to my daughter Linkly ten pounds sterl. and to
 my daughter Providence ten pounds sterl. Item. I give grant & devise
 unto my son Christopher Linkly & his wife Ann their heirs & assigns
 forever all of four hundred acres of land which I purchased with my son
 in partnership from y^e Lords pp^o y^e whole being eight hundred acres hee
 paying no consideration thereof to my son John Brimball the sume of
 ten pounds within one year after my death. Item. I give & bequeath
 unto my dear & loving wife all my rings plates jewells with her
 choice of my featherbeds one bolster two pillows two pare of sheets
 a blanket, Curtaines Counterpane or rug & also one negro girl and
 giving & likewise one full third part of all singular the remainder of
 my personall estate of what kind & nature whatsoever. Item. I give
 to y^e my wife shall have to her self besides the foregoing before to y^e sume of
 fifty pounds which she hath made of her will thing of y^e same how y^e
 of y^e she shall not be accountable for the same.

of remaining two third parts of my small Estate to my children following
 vizt: Thomas Grimball John Grimball Mary Hamilton Ann Linkley
 & Providence Grimball to be equally divided among them share & share alike
 & in case any of y^e Should die & under age y^e share of him or them dying
 shall go to y^e survivor & survivors of them. Itm. I leave my loving
 wife Mary my sole Executrix of this my last will & testament & do hereby make
 null void all former wills by me made & do hereby declare this my last
 will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand & seal this
 thirtieth day of December Anno Domini 1698

 Province of Carolina to be enjoyed by him & his heirs forever. I give y^e
 decrease of my said loving wife. Lastly I will order nominate & appoint
 my said loving wife Mary Rose my true & sole Executrix of this my last

 sound mind perfect memory praised be God do make this my last will
 & testament in manner & terms following. First I bequeath my soul
 & spirit into y^e hands of Almighty God my heavenly father my body to
 y^e Earth to be buried at y^e discretion of my Executrix, & my worldly
 estate to be disposed of as follows I give & bequeath unto my dear wife
 Mary Rose all y^e piece of land that lyeth next y^e Raddapp w^{it} was
 bought of Andrew Dawson by y^e owⁿ left hand off y^e Broad path as
 you goe into y^e Country, to him this assigns forever. I likewise request
 my Executrix to make a little to him of y^e piece of land which lies next to my
 dwelling house which I gave to him with my daughter. Sales give him
 my best silver headed cane. I give to Sarah Chett daughter to Capt^l Mill^r
 Chett ten pounds p^{er} into y^e hands of mother to buy her a gould chain.
 I give to Doct^r Atkin Williamson ten pounds. I give unto Doct^r Thomas
 Side ten pounds. I give to y^e poor of Charles Towne fifteen pounds. I give
 & bequeath to Thomas Proffer twenty pounds. I give unto my loving
 wife Martha my dwelling house in Charles Towne w^{it} was

 & devise y^e said house stand to my son Thomas and Robert
