In the Name of God Amen I — day of December in the year of
Our Lord 1799 Edward Rawlins of Lawerston in the Province of South Carolina
being sick & weak of body but of sound & full mind & memory thankes to the
Almighty God for his to make this my last will & Testament in manner & form following
(that is to say) first I recommend my soul to Almighty God my maker &
believing of it shall receive full pardon & the mission of hell instant to be saved by
the precious death & merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ. Item I give to my
wife Susanna Rawlins all my estate now & hereafter to have & to hold in her
thereafter named Estate think well & convenient that as I have no son or daughter
as yet in which case I have my wife Susanna & my daughters thereof employed
& followed as her after by her my wife & her issue & children in common cause her
late son & all in the same to me & my wife & her issue to be my
last will & Testament. Item in that it shall be my will & desire in right
or consequence being number 2 item I give to my wife Susanna all my contents & goods
& chattels whatsoever I now have or may have by my said
hereafter named. Item I give to my wife Susanna all my lands & tenements
Susanna Rawlins all my Estate now & hereafter to have & to hold in equal
life giving & quieting unto my wife Susanna all power & authority to
sell or dispose of my farm as she shall see necessary for an maintenance & bringing
up of my children my wife is of opinion that Susanna shall sell or dispose of
y^t part of part of my estate & settle the same upon her selfe & her husband
equally divided betwixt my husband & her selfe that Susanna & her husband
of them shall die or depart therefore before they shall come to see me & all y^t part
of y^t part of her selfe & her husband to be divided amongst y^t part of me
living & of them please God & all my children & their whols life & property
of them shall come to age my will & meaning of y^t parts where fore I declare & command
be equally divided betwixt y^t part of them & Susanna & her husband & her
other heirs to their proper use & behoove for ever. Item in that I do hereby command
my loving wife Susanna a piece to be about 1/3 of the my last will & Testament & I
desire her to have care of my children after my death among y^t wife Susanna &
ordain & desire my loving friends Robt. Daniel Esq^r Mr James Stewart & Capt
John Howe overseers of them jointly or severally to be executors of this my last will
& testament & have care & charge of y^t part of my Estate asfore & as shall be
left by my wife at her decease & for care of my children as aforesaid giving
unto my Execut^r & either of them full power & lawful authority by their
present to sell or dispose of any part of my Estate left by my wife at
her decease as they shall think needfull for y^t bringing up of my children.

In the Name of God Amen I Beth Grinnall of Edisto Island
in Colleton County S.C. being y^t old & sick & weak but of sound mind and memory
thank God to y^t Lord to make my last will & Testament. Imp^r. I give unto
my dear & honest wife Mary Grinnall my plantation on Edisto Island containing
one hundred acres of land bee the same more or less with all the houses
buildings & improvements belonging during her natural life. Item After
my death I give unto my son Thomas Grinnall all my
plantation of sixteen hundred acres apiece with the buildings theron. I have also
sold my 2nd plantation & buildings therow to my son Thomas Grinnall his
heirs & assignees forever. Item My will is y^t my son Thomas Grinnall in
consideration of the various plantation & buildings shall pay within one
year after my wife's death the following sumes vizt to my daughter
Hamilton ten pounds sterl. To my daughter Lucy ten pounds sterl. and to
my daughter Providence ten pounds sterl. Item I give grant & demise
unto my son Christopher Linkley & his wife Ann their heirs & assignees
beginning all y^t four hundred acres of land which I purchased with my P^r son
in partnership from y^t Lord pp^r 1/3 y^t whole being eight hundred acres bee
paying in consideration thereof to my son John Grinnall the sume of
Run pounds within one year after my death. Item I give & bequeath
unto my dear & loving wife all my rings plates jewels with her
choice of my featherbeds one bolster two pillows two pair of sheets
a blanket curtains counterpane or rugg & also one large girl's bed
Giving & likewise one full third part of all singular the remainder of
my personal estate of what kind soever whther money. Item I give
to my wife shall have to her selfe besides the foregoing legacy of Run
fifty pounds which she hath made of several things of y^t same kind y^t
of y^t she shall not be accountable for the same. Item I do

of remanuring two third parts of my personal Estate to my children following
Capt. Thomas Grinnall John Grinnall Mary Hamilton and Lintly &
Woodward Grinnall to be equally divided among them share & share alike
in case any of you should die under way of share of him or them dying
shall go to the survivor & survivors of them. Item I leave my loving
wife Mary my sole Executrix of this my last will & testament & do hereby make
and record all former wills by me made & do hereby declare this my last
will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this
thirtieth day of December Anno Domini 1895

In the name of God Almon I John Lewis of y^e Province
of Carolina above named Cordwainer interting by his assistance for a long age
to deal & knowing howe lord may that with me in this present voyage to
make this my last will & testament in manner & form following. I impriue
first & principally giving my soul to God my creator & my body to
peace & Almighty God my body to y^e Earth to be disposed of as the Lord shall
think fit. Also Astony Estate I am possessed of in y^e Province of Carolina
both real and personal goods chattels &c to sever I give & bequeath y^e same unto my
loving wife Mary Creope to be enjoyed by her during her life after her death
to be disposed of as the shall order & appoint. Item I will give & bequeath
unto my loving son in law William Bayley my now dwelling house
at one half of y^e lot thereunto belonging situated in Charles Town in y^e
Province of Carolina to be enjoyed by him & his heirs for ever [after] y^e
decease my said loving wife. Lastly I will order nominate & appoint
my said loving wife Mary Creope my true trusty Executrix of this my last

will & testament & hereby declare this to be my last will & testament whereof I do
unto this my will affix my hand & seal of County third day of March Anno Domini 1895

In the name of God Almon I John Lewis of y^e Province of Carolina
on the 20th day of December 1895 I Jonathan
Murray of y^e Province of Carolina being weak in body yet of
sound mind & perfect memory praised be God I do make this my last will &
testament in manner & form following of right. First I bequeath my soul
& spirit unto y^e hands of Almighty God my heavenly father my body to
y^e Earth to be buried at y^e discretion of my Executrix & my worldly
estate to be disposed of as follows I give & bequeath unto my son Joseph
Grosjean all y^e piece of land that lyeth next y^e Rathapp w^t was
bought of Andrew Lawson by the left hand off Broadpath as
you goe into y^e Country to him this Augus^t for ever. Likewise I give
my Executrix to make a little to him of y^e piece of land which lyeth next to my
dwelling house which I gave to him with my daughter. Also give unto
my best silver headed cane. I give to Sarah Chett^s daughter to Capt. Hill
Chett ten pounds p^t into y^e hands of mother to buy her a gold chain.
I give to Doct^r Atkin Williamson ten pounds. I give unto Doct^r Thomas
Sole ten pounds. I give to y^e poor of Charles Town fifteen pounds also
bequeath to Thomas Hobler twenty pounds. I give unto my loving
wife Martha my dwelling house in Charles Town called land
in about y^e same during her natural life & after her death I give
& devise y^e said house & land to my sons Thomas and Robert
