Robert Shattell to whom these presents above named, at the same place he
heard or read "Daniel the Day Saint" was now deceased in said town not
over his Master's house at Boston. Shattell remained in Boston two
years yet then in the state of New Hampshire he became a peddler of
stationery and haberdashery goods & so continued to travel in said State a
wealthy merchant. Subsequently returning to Boston he resided in an apartment
upon the body of Faneuil Hall. At a very early age he was married and left
Shattell his birth and dying place as well as his death date are not
of record. Robert Shattell died in Boston in the year of 1807 and was buried
at the same place where his wife is buried. He died in Boston
the Eleventh stage of life with years of reasoning power
Lord William of Gladstone in his speech at Liverpool January 1880.

pertaining to acts of assembly 1848-1850 & summarized by W. C. Underhill, Esq., Oct. 1, 1851.

In the Name of God Amen I Henry Dowell of the Island of St. John
doe make this my last will & Testament considering of frailty of humaine life do make this my last will &
Testament in manner and forme following. I my selfe give and bequeath
unto my dear and loving wife Margarett Dowell my negroe woman called
Black Moll and her two sons Dick and Cobus and all other children
she shall happen to have at y^t time of my decease w^tch of any other
negroe woman in my plantation in St. John in case she shall like any better
than black Moll. Item Charged with and subject to a proportionable
share off payment of the legacies to bequests in and by this my will given and
bequeathed I give devise and bequeath unto my 2 wife one moiety or equal
halfe

halfe part off all profit & produce of my plantation, negro household goods & whole estate reall and personall to have & enjoy the same during her life & upon her full satisfaction of any dower thrids or other claims whch she may have was entituled unto out of my estate and in case my said wife shall then die y^er after my decease I give and bequeath unto her one third part only off all my profit & produce of my sd estate during her life and y^er s^t third part I will take in like manner as full of any dower thrids or demands whch she may be any waies entituled to out of my estate. Item. I give unto my two daughters Mary & Mary Dowdell the sum of three hundred pounds money of heire apiece, or Sixty thousand pounds weight of sugar apiece to be paid or delivered unto them at their respective ages of eighteen years & said two last mentioned legacies & portions given to my said daughters my will commandeth is shall be raised out of y^er profits of my sd plantation and the stock therow. Also will and desire that my sd two daughters shall be maintained and educated out of y^er profits of my sd plantation untill they shall be married and in case my said daughters or either of them shall happen to depart this life before they shall respectively attaine their sd ages of eighteen years my will commandeth that the legacy & portion given to her who shall dye shall go and remaine to y^er benefit of those to whom she shal bequeathed my sd plantation Also I will and bequeath unto each of my said daughters one negro girl about four years of age to be delivered to each of my said daughters by my Execut^r on y^er respective dayes of their marriages. Item also unto my two sons Philip George Dowdell their heirs Execut^r & Administrat^r all my plantation me giv^en Stock household goods tail & the my reall and personall Estate a boord in the st Leland of Davis or elsewhere except what is above by this my will given to me & wife and daughters And I do hereby make & constitute my sd two sons sole Execut^r & Administrat^r of this my will and in case either of my sd sons shal befall to depart this life without issue of his body my will commandeth that y^er part & share alwaye I recd and personall Estate given to him so dying shall go and remaine to their heires Execut^r & Administrat^r and in case both my sd sons shal befall to depart this life without issue then my will commandeth that all such part of my reall & personall estate as by this my will given to them so dying shall go and remaine to my said two daughters their heires Execut^r & Administrat^r. Item I do hereby nominate to appoint my dearest loeing wife and my well beloved friend Capt Willm. Head & Mr Henry Barrell Mr James Brown to be Executors of my sd four children untill they shall attaine their age of one Sixtene years to be also Execut^r of this my last will in Trust for my sd two Sons during their minority and I do give unto y^er trustees one Sease hat to each of them in case they shall act as the said Ex^rship for their care and pains therein. Item I do hereby nominate to make and do make and constitute this to be my last will & testement. In witness whereof I have hereunto sette my hand and seal this twentyeighth day of December Annoq 1688 and in the eightyeighth year of y^e reign of King William the third over England &c.
