No 28 Carolina p. Wm. R. Berkley. In the name of God Amen. I John Johns late of the City of London but now of Charles Town in the County & Province above being sick in body but of sound & perfect memory thank God Almighty God do leave this my Codicill to the last will & Testament which I left behind me in England to Impns. My will is that my Execut^t mentioned in the my Codicill do pay all my debts which I owe in Carolina my funeral expenses. I give & bequeath to George Logan Esq Capt William Smith Justice two of my Executors of this my Codicill for their trouble ten pounds each of them in Carolina money. Item. All q^t rest residue owing estate in Carolina after my debts funeral expenses & legacies is discharged. I give to my beloved wife Frances my Execut^t in this Row^t his sum with to be equally divided between them both my wife is near y^t too Execut^t residing in Carolina (viz) Geo Logan Esq Capt William Smith do have & hold of same to them in England or otherwise as they shall direct. Item. I give devise and bequeath to my wife Frances Johns all that dividend which shall belong to her of my estate in Carolina given to her during her natural life or time of widowhood and after her decease or marriage same to be equally divided between my two daughters Mary & Martha Johns to hold in the undivided interest till death their heirs & assignees forever. Lastly I do constitute my executors Francis Johns Execut^t my portion Master Hawkins & George Logan & Capt William Smith Executors to this my Codicill And whereas my brother Edmund Johns deceased did leave in my hands twenty pounds to be paid out of my estate in Carolina before divided as follows the said twenty pounds to be paid Mary Johns two pounds to his own mother Elizabeth Johns & five pounds to his widow in case this should occur before my two Execut^t residing in Carolina to get them round the money house. In witness whereof I the said John Johns have hereunto set my hand & date & do declare this to be my Codicill to my last will & Testament left in London this eighth day of October anno Domini 1858 Sealed and published and declared in the presence of

Before sealing - And whereas I have in my hands twenty pounds of the Francis Johns property left to me by my will devised is that my two Execut^t residing here do remit y^t same to him out of my estate before divided.

Dr. ff' Lavelle Doctor Williamson & within witnesses did on the Holy Evangelists declare that they did in y^t within named John Johns sign seal & publish y^t within to be a Codicill to the last will & Testament left in England that the said John Johns was of sound memory at the so doing.
