

Richard Quintyne

Carolina: In the name of God Amen, I, the 21st day
June 1671 I Richard Quintyne of the Province of North Carolina
Berkley, Gentlemen, being sick & weak but of perfect memory
(thanks be given to Almighty God) doe therefore make & declare this my last will
and testament as followeth viz: I give unto my soul to God
and my body to the Earth to be decently buried according to the direction of
my Administrators hereafter named: I give unto my beloved wife
Elizabeth Quintyne the moiety of the profits of my plantation on which I
live or elsewhere in the said Province and County above written as alone
for accommodation in my dwellinghouse with together with allowance for
housekeeping as in my lifetime and is in lieu of her dowry for her lifetime.
Item I give unto my daughter Anne the fifty pounds sterlings to be paid her within
two years after her marriage or the birth of her second child. Item I give unto
my daughter Anne fifty pounds to be paid her two years after her marriage.
Item I give unto my daughter Elizabeth her maintenance & clothing and
not to be full of from my plantation during her life if she remaine soe
impotent as she is, but if it shall please God to bless her with perfect
health & birth of body and mind I give her fifty pounds sterlings to be paid
her two years after her marriage. Item I give unto my daughter Jane
fifty pounds to be paid two years after her marriage. Item I give unto my
son Henry Quintyne and to his heirs all my Estate both the real and
personal (excepting what is before bequeathed) at the age of twenty one
years having first proportionally of my legacies with my Administrators
Whatsoever is given and bequeathed to me in England by the last
of my will. Item Richard Quintyne of London Goldsmith deceased, I
give unto my son Henry Quintyne and his heirs and for want of
lawfull heirs premises the equally divided amongst my daughters.
Item The rest and residue small and singular of my Personal Estate
whatsoever after my debts paid and legacies performed funerals charges
discharged I wholly give will and bequeath unto my said wife Elizabeth
Quintyne whom I make ordaine my full and sole Administratrix
of this my last will and testament and receiver & guardian of my children
during y^e minority and desiring her in every respect to be faithful in the
performance of this my last will and testament. Revoking pronouncing man-
ding will and said all former wills and promises before this time made
or caused to be made and will this to stand for my very last will and
testament none other to the contrary. Item I desire Mr. Schuster
- to be assistant to my wife in y^e performance of this my will. In
Witness whereof I the said Richard Quintyne have to this my last will
and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written
