Carolina: In the Name of God Amens, I say that I am
done Mys. 1 Richard Quintyne of the office of foreman with the County of
Berkeley, Gentleman, being sick & weak but of perfect memory
(which is given to Almighty God) do therefore make & declare this my last will
and testament as followeth viz: In witness I begreathe my soul to God
and my body to the Earth to be decently buried according to the direction of
my Administratior hereafter named. I give unto my beloved wife
Elizabeth Quintyne the moiety of the proffits of my plantation on which I
live or elsewhere in this said Province and County above written as also
for accomodation in my dwellinghouse with together with allowance for
housekeeping as in my lifetime and is in lue of her Dowry for her lifetime.
Item. I give unto my daughter Martha fifty pounds sterl to be paid her within
two years after her marriage or the birth of her second child. Item. I give unto
my daughter Mary fifty pounds to be paid her two years after her marriage.
Item. I give unto my daughter Elizabeth her maintenance & cloathing and
not to be putt of from my plantation during her life if she remaine so
incompetent as she is, but if it shall please God to bles her with perfect
health both of body and minde I give her fifty pounds sterl to be paid
her two years after her marriage. Item. I give unto my daughter Jane
fifty pounds to be paid her two years after her marriage. Item. I give unto my
son Henry Quintyne and to his heirs at my Estate both real and
personal (excepting what is before bequeathed) at the age of twenty one
years. Having had particularity of my legacies with my Administratior.
Also whatsoever is given and bequeathed to me in England by the said
dying uncle Mr Richard Quintyne of London Gentleman deceased, I
give unto my son Henry Quintyne under his heirs and for want of
himself being present to be equally divided amongst my daughters.
Item. The rest and residue right and singular of my personal Estate
whatsoever after my debts paid and legatis performed, funeral charges
settled. I whole give well and bequeath unto my said wife Elizabeth
Quintyne whom I make ordaine my full and sole Administratior
of this my present will and testament. And counseil & guardian of my children
during y^e minority and desiring her in every respect to be faithfull unto
Performance of this present will and testament. Revoking, pronouncing man
ching null and void all former wills and promises before this time made
or caused to be made and will this to stand for my very last will and
testament none other or other to the contrary. Item. I desire Mr John Ber
esford to be assistant to my wife in y^e performance of this my will. In
witness whereof I the said Richard Quintyne have to this my present Will
and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written
