I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Judith Penning my neg^r boy Essex by name all my house & lands & house furniture and one bed, being in tract I give & bequeath all horses mares & cattle whatsoever belongeth to me all and every particular thing notwithstanding several desiring Mr John Beaman & Mr Randolph Evans to see that she may not be wronged outby thing leaving them as Executors hoping that will do for the best if she be att^t ched I desire that if it be a boy he may have the houses and lands and other things to be equally divided between them self & a boy or girl. liquidate in the presence of Peter Pennington Sam'l Scott

N^o 17 Richard Vincent considering the mortality of mankind the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time of its happening fit to dispose of what it hath pleased God to give me, recommending firstly to the merciful hands of God and of our Saviour Jesus Christ and my body to the Earth to be buried in decent and Christian like manner as my Friends hereafter named shall think fit. And that my will may be better formed I constitute and appoint my dearely beloved wife Martha Vincent my exec^r and bequeath one fourth part of my lands slaves goods and chattels to be by her and her heirs fully possessed and enjoyed forever. Item. To my beloved daughter Anne Vincent and her heirs forever I give and bequeath one fourth part of my said lands slaves goods and chattels to be by her fully possessed and enjoyed - and one gray horse named Sally. Item. To my well beloved daughter Mary Vincent and her heirs forever I give and bequeath one fourth part of my lands slaves goods & chattels to be by her fully possessed and enjoyed. Item. To my well beloved daughter Katharine Vincent I give and bequeath one fourth part of my Estates lands slaves goods & chattels asforesaid to be by her heirs fully possessed & enjoyed forever. Lastly. In witness and memory of this my last will and testam't is, that my Estate, aforesaid moveable and unmoveable after my debts aforesaid are paid shall after my decease as soon as possible be equally and quietly shared & divided between my above named wife and my said three daughters and to the longest live of them, and my said wife to live on my plantation whilst a widow and no longer, to manage my Estate to her own & my children's advantage, both if she marries. To have & share & use of my plantation. If my estate by loss or otherwise decrease or become insufficient my wife is that everyone concerned shall be a proportionable loss. Item. I will have no lawsuit about what I leave but all differences submitted to her or state friend or neighbors. Lastly. I declare what is above written to be my last will and testam't desiring its may take effect notwithstanding any neglect

mistakes that may be committed in it which I desire may be made you satisfied in the best manner that is possible. In witness whereof I have put my hand seal this twenty third day of June in the year of our thousand seven hundred and eighteen nineteen.

Copy to me

In the Name of God Almighty. The twenty fifth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighteen nineteen do tell you of the Reign of your Sovereign Lord George by the Grace of God of Great Britain France & Ireland King Defender of the Faith &c. I Roger Player in Christ Church Parish in the County of South Carolina United States sick and weak in body but of sound mind & perfect mind and memory (thanks be to God for the same) and knowing the uncertainty of this transient life on Earth and being desirous to settle things in order to make & publish and declare this to be my last will & testament containing & declaring by these presents all severally the former will and written testaments by me heretofore made & declared either by word or writing the only is to be taken for my last will and testament and none other.

First. I command myself to God my Creator & Redeemer my body to be buried in such decent & Christian manner as to my Executors hereinafter named shall be thought fit convenient and as to this settling my temporal estate such goods chattels & debts as I hath pleased God for above my debts to bestow upon me. In order give degreeable & disposer of the same in manner & forme following (that is to say) I me & primis I will that all debts & charges or in consequence I justly owe to any manner of person or persons whatsoever shall well & truly paid or ordered to be paid within convenient time after my decease by my Executors hereinafternamed. Item. I give and bequeath to my son Roger Player one half of my plantation with one half of the stock therein except one negro boy named Poplar wch I give and bequeath to my loving son Roger Player with the other half part of my plantation stock togeather to be equally divided when my son

shall come to the age of twenty one years. Item. It being will and desire of my son Roger to continue on the plantation at the end of all the slaves & stock excepting the negro man now who is to be hired out to Franklyn Estate my said son Roger being accountable to me Executors jointly for his full the profits thereof wch shall be towards the maintenance of my son Thomas. Item. I desire that Eliza Cornish may live with the house as the nurse & maid on the plantation aforesaid with the use of three acres of land adjoining to the same during her life. Item. I give the deceased son William Hackett half a certain lot bounded as of platt grant & Lastly. I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my good friends Mr William Hackett and Capt. Nath'l Partridge to be my jointly & severally Executors of this my last will & testament wherof I have hereunto set my hand seal the day & year first above written.

In the Name of God Amen I John Whitmarsh No 18 line of Ballston County Planter being weak of body yet of perfect mind & memory / praece be given therfore to Almighty God to make & claim this my present last will & testament in manner & forme following (that is to say) as touching the disposition of all such temporal Estate as I hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me. I give & dispose thereof as followeth. First. I will that my debts and funeral charges shall be paid & discharged. Item. I give the greatest summy living son John two tracts of land on Ashopee Island one containing five hundred acres the other one hundred, and also three tracts of land on a creek out of Ashopee River one containing three hundred acres of land one containing two hundred & one containing two hundred & twenty. Item. I give the greatest summy living daughter Edith two tracts of lands on a branch of Ashopee River one containing one hundred acres & is known by the name of Turkey Hill & the other containing one hundred & fifty eight acres known by the name of
