or wrought plate which said negro & Indian slaves with the above bequeathed
stock of cattle horses mares sheep & hogs and all and every of their future
respective increase and all and singular these be bequeathed three hundred
Seventy two acres of land and all and singular the appurtenances thereto
belonging unto me or mine was appertaining I bequeath unto my aforesaid loving
wife Mary Seabrook forever ^{that husband and one fourth for her any other proper her bequeathed and bequeathed} free and clear and freely and clearly acquitted
satisfied and discharged of and from the payment of all and all manner
debts due and demands whatsoever according as the same was formerly
by me given unto my aforesaid loving wife and her heirs and assigns forever
by the name of Mary Seabrook in all and every the before mentioned bequeathed
particulars by a deed of gift bearing date the eight day of August and in the
year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & twenty wth said deed of gift

 all and singular the opportunities therein belonging in any way appertain-
 ing. Always provided that my aforesaid loving brother Joseph Seabrook
 his heirs executors or administrators shall and do well and truly pay & cause to
 be paid unto all my respective Creditors all and every sum and sums debt
 and debts legacies and bequests herein given as well as all my funeral char-
 ges & out any trouble occasion or demand to be made by any person or
 persons whatsoever of any of my debts which I owe or any legacies that are or
 shall be given by this my last will and testament of my aforesaid loving
 wife Mary Seabrook. And that he furnish or cause to be furnished for my said
 loving wife Mary Seabrook in all respects with household furniture & house
 begun on Madenlow Island on the land and plantation bequeathed to my
 aforesaid loving wife Mary Seabrook and his heirs and assigns forever.
 And fourthly in case my aforesaid brother Joseph Seabrook shall refuse
 or neglect to pay all undervy my lawful debts and legacies that are or

 I hereby renounce make void and of none effect all other wills and tes-
 taments by me heretofore made and declare that I neither take my last will and
 testament. Sixthly I will and bequeath unto my master fellow Simpson his
 freedom immediately after my decease and my will is that the two Indian
 Slaves bequeathed to my sister Ann Parrott be delivered to her immediately
 after my decease. Lastly I will and appoint my loving brother Joseph
 Seabrook and the Hon^{ble} Landgrave Joseph Norton to be the auditors and
 executors of this my last will and testament withing them to deliver unto
 my brother in law ^{William} ~~John~~ head of yeards cattle off my Island & I wenter
 granteth him by my deceased father Capt Robert Seabrook and
 also to suffer all other who have any stock upon my full title by my
 permission to take them off. In witness whereof I have hereunto set
