In the Name of God Amen. I John Player of the County of Kent in the year of
our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven in the fifth year
of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George by the Grace of God of Great
Britain France & Ireland King of England in the fourth &c. of Great Britain
in Christ Church Parish in the County of South Kent in the County of Kent being
sick and weak in body both of sense and of feeling mind and memory
(thanks be to God for the same) and being aware of the uncertainty of this
worldly life on Earth and being desirous to settle things in order do make
order publish and declare this to be my last will & testament & so
proclaiming by these presents all severall things of former will and Wills testament
& testaments by me heretofore made declared either by word or writing other
only to be taken for my last will and testament and none other.

First I commend myself to God my Creator & Redeemer in my body
& to be buried in such decent Christian manner as my Executors hereafter
named shall see thought fit convenient and use of the settling my tem-
poral estate such goods chattels & debts as it hath pleased God for
above my debts to bestow upon me his ordinary bequest & dis-
pose of the same in manner & forme following (that is to say) I give
& give I will that all debts due to or in consequence I justly owe
to any manner of person or persons whatsoever shall well & truly paid
or ordered to be paid within convenient time after my decease by
my Executors hereafter named. Item I give and bequeath to my son
Roger Player one half of my plantation with one half of the stock
& negroes thereon except one negro boy named Onefan w^{ch} I give and
bequeath to my loving son Tho: Player with the other half part of
my plantation stock negroes to be equally divided when my son
that

Thos comes to the age of twenty one years. Item I give my will and desire that
my son Roger should continue on the plantation w^{ch} the use of all the slaves &
stock excepting the negro man Sam who is to be hired out in Town by my Executors
my said son Roger being accountable to my Executors yearly for his full share
profits thereof w^{ch} shall be towards the maintenance of my son Thomas
Item I desire that Eliza: Cornish may live in the house as she now lives in on the
plantation aforesaid with the use of three acres of land adjoining to the same
during her life. Item I give & bequeath to my son William Hackett half a ton
lot bounded as follows to wit: Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and
appoint my good friends Mr. William Hackett and Capt. Nathl: Partridge
to be my jointly & severally Executors of this my last will & testament in testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year first above written.
