November 15th 1692. I, Robert Bishop now make & doe through my
perfect memory & right remembrance declare & say unto my Soul to God
Almighty my body to be interred from whence I came from him. I have long
daughter Mary Bishop of Richmond, my name w^t y^e white buildings house
live in at Far & Smart half the same number of years as
bed tall things there was. I have a son named John Bishop & he is now 1
given to William & his wife Mary who are now about 20th & she still has
young woman to hand & a two month old baby boy & living about sixteen
months old. One more the last of my children is a son named James &
he delivered in y^e three weekes backe & he is now 1st & he is now 1st &
Child one hundre^d about sixteen we have a goodly inheritance and so much
y^e I have forgot of it may be easily recoverable. This is my dearest son my
Bishop & William Elmes.

to London to her relations there w^t I desire my Execut^t to do as afores
