

L L The Last will and Testament of Sarah Brewster, Bunde No. 32.
No. 32 I, Sarah Brewster of the County of Berkley Province of South Carolina
widow being in perfect health under sound judgment memory thanks to God
for it declare this my last will and testament in form manner following. I command
my soul to God before this my 3^d Testamente for the pardon of
all my sins and a gracious acceptance with himself at the last day and
my body to the Earth to be decently buried by Mr Hugh West whom I appoint my
Executor of this my will working with other formerly by me made fact that
portion of goods which it hath pleased my heavenly father against me to dispense
of as follows. 1 I order all my debts to be paid. 2 I bequeath unto
Margaret Elappa five hundred pounds to negroes left Wallington &
Matthew also Mr Francis his silver seal with the coat of arms of his
family on it my gold Buckle. He taught of her children Elizabeth and my
bequeath five hundred pounds which if it should happen that one of the
said children should die before the payment of the said five hundred
pounds then in that case my will is that the survivor should inherit
(with her own) the five hundred pounds of the deceased. Should they
both die I appoint her the said Margaret Elappa to inherit what I
have to each of her children left. 3 I bequeath to my sister Anna
Brew during her natural life my bed chamber with its furniture and
my wearey apparel & the attendance of Flora. 4 I bequeath to a
deserting Pastor or Preacher and his successors in that Office forever
on the Rock and to be settled over a tract of land lately purchased from
Mr John Charles by deed of gift given to him & them forever for ever for
that uses One hundred pounds per annum for twenty years. I leave to
him the said Deserting Pastor or teacher this successors forever I do
bequeath

bequeath to one negro Anne that to one woman late brought of Africa
Slav. to him and her forever I bequeath my silver tankard and
Cups. 5 I bequeath unto that Anna Dool childer of my nephew and
Bones five hundred pounds each. Should one die before the payment
of the said five hundred pounds the survivor I appoint to inherit the
five hundred pounds after deceased & should both dying will is that
the father should inherit the entire thousand pounds. 6 I bequeath to
Elizabeth Hadrel daughter to my niece Susanna Hadrel five hundred
pounds if she should die before the payment of the said five hundred pounds
I appoint the said Susanna Hadrel heir to her daughter
7 I bequeath unto John Hobins two hundred pounds & should he die before
the payment of the said two hundred pounds I appoint the said John just
son to my nephew Thomas Bone Senr to inherit the said two hundred
pounds. 8 I bequeath to Thomas Totwell son of my niece Martha
West five hundred pounds. I leave to Michael Beresford five
hundred pounds and I shall either of them die before the payment
of his five hundred pounds I appoint the survivor of them to inherit
the five hundred pounds after deceased and if both die I appoint
Sarah West just to inherit the thousand pounds that shall be left.
9 I bequeath to my Sister Mary Mulling attorney chancery money
sums. 10 I bequeath unto Henry Livingston Junr three negro children
viz Dowey Cyrus & Lucy. 11 I bequeath to the deserting Pasto
or Teacher of Glunby twenty pounds per annum for twenty years to the
deserting Pastor or Teacher at Service I bequeath ten pounds per
year for twenty years. 12 I ordain that One thousand pounds be paid to Capt
John Thunderhorst and Capt Anthony Matthews Junr whome I appoint
my trustees for the disposing of the said thousand pounds to such persons
as I have signified to them. 13 I appoint my neice Mary West his
freedom upon the condition that he pay five pounds current money yearly
to the deserting Pastor or teacher on this stock. I leave to I appoint Old
Lady her freedom on condition she pay to said deserting Teacher yearly
five shillings. 14 I bequeath all the rest of my estate real personal
unto Mr Hugh West repaying the abovementioned legacies with all
concurrent speed according to the present value or currency of money
and at his death I appoint to ordain that the one entire half of my said
estate real and personal shall descend to my neice Sarah West &
her heirs forever & the other half to be disposed of at the pleasure of him
the said Hugh West. This I publish & declare to be my last will &
testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this 26th day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred
Twenty six in the presence of - Monocaudum that before the signing
sealing this writing of this my will the word, Walter Freeman, was inter-

Council Chamber September the 1st 1797
Personally appeared before me George Simcock,
Arthur Hethington & Thomas Barton Junr. three of the witnesses before-
witnessed will & testament of Sarah Penwick deceased hereto annexed and being
only sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God did declare as follows
that is to say the Testator was present & did set the said instrument in
seal published and declare the aforesaid instrument contained in the same
sheet of paper to be her last will & testament and that the name Sarah
Penwick there subscribed was of her own handwriting toward John
Hethington and Thomas Barton sometime afterwards appears
they could remember was about a day or two were desired by the
testator to attest her will according to which desire they repaired
to the testator's house where she exhibited the said instrument to them
and after her acknowledging her name and seal to be her act and
deed desired them to subscribe their several names as witnesses
thereto and the three deponents further declare severally that at the
time of her signing sealing & publishing the same she was of sound
disposinng mind memory and understanding according to the best
of their knowledge.

L. L. No 34. The last will and testament of the Richard Wigg, Esq: D. D. 1034
In the Name of God Amen I Richard Wigg of Charleston
in the Province of South Carolina Untrac^t being sick and weak in bodily
spiritual mind and memory (Pray for me) do make and give this
my last will and testament in manner & form following that is to say.
First and principally I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty
God hoping through the satisfaction merit and intercession of my only
Saviour dear Redeemer Jesus Christ to have full and free pardon
of all my sins and to inherit eternal life my body I commit to the
Earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named as
as far as temporal estate as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me
I give and dispose of my possessions I will that all my just debts
and funeral expenses shall be paid and discharged. Item I give direct
and bequeath all my lot Town lots in Beaufort Town at Port Royal to
my son Thomas Wigg and Richard Wigg to be equally divided between
them three and share alike which said lots I give unto them and to
their heirs & assigns forever. Item I give unto my son Thomas Wigg

my boats and furniture the boat belonging to me. Item I give unto my son Edward
Wigg the sum of one hundred pounds current money of the United States
to be paid in twelve months after my decease by my Executors hereinbefore
named. Item I give unto my dear and loving wife Sarah Wigg my
negroe woman Simeon and all her children. Item I give devise and
bequeath unto my said wife Sarah for the maintenance of her self and
children and for the support and education of my said children by her
all the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal now in
this Province as elsewhere which I give and bequeath to her and to
her heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby ordain nominate
and appoint my said wife Sarah full and sole Executrix of this my
last will and testament and also take & receive of my children
Edward, Mary, Hillerdon & Catherine and I do hereby revoke
all former and other wills by me at anytime heretofore made and
do publish and declare this to be and stand as one for my last will
and testament. In witness whereof I have written my last will & testa-
ment, set my hand & seal this thirtieth day of August, in the year
of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and forty seven.
