Desiring to be buried after death in a decent and Christian like manner and after my death and funeral largesse had I spoken thereof afterwards. I desire to give and bequeath unto Mary Wyatt my loving wife all my estate both real and personal left to me in my receipt whatsoever In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirteenth day of November 1721 in the fifth year of the Reign of his Majestie King George the third and of his term wills by me made declaring this to be my last will and Testament.

A. In the Name of God Amen I Peter Pasquereau of Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina Merchant being of sound and disposing mind and memory (blessed be God for y: name) Do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner & form following first I command my soul into the hands of Almighty God my Body I committ to y: Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named touching such temporal estate as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me I give and dispose thereof as thereof as follows. I imprie I will that all my just debts & funeral expenses be first paid and discharged and that what so ever unto me Stephen Godwin of London Merchant be paid unto him in London by the Alard Belin of London Merchant out of what shall be remitted to him by my Executors according to my directions hereinafter mentioned. Item. It is my mind & Will and I do hereby ordene and appoint that my Executors hereinafter named and y: survivor<sup>es</sup> of them within ten days after my decease or soon after as may be to sell convey & dispose off to y: highest bidder and his heirs and assigns forever all and every my lands tenements and hereditaments within this Province to be paid in Rece y: one half the net crop after my decease & y: other half y: crop ensuing. Item I give and bequeath all such sum and sums of money as shall arise by sale of my lands and hereditaments as aforesaid and all and singular my whole personal Estate whatsoever and wheresoever unto my loving wife Mary Pasquereau & my loving son and daughter John and Mary Magdalene their Execs and Admrs forever equally to be divided between them share & share alike. Item my mind and will is that my said Execs do remitt and send y: produce of all my whole Estate both real & personal unto y: said Alard Belin upon y: proper account and risque of my said wife & son and daughter. Item. It is my mind twill that my said wife removes with her self and her said two children from St Thomas's to St Christopher's and there resides at them and not return agen to St Thomas's and in mind and willis that in case of her sepa rate or neglecting to do upon notice of this my desire by my Execs or y: s: Alard Belin then her part and interest of
