of my personal estate goods and chattels whosoever I desire and I separate unto my
loving wife (Mary Branford). And I likewise constitute and appoint my dear
beloved wife Mary Branford to be my Executrix and my son John Branford
and my Cousin John Bull and my son Thomas Branford to be my Executors
of this my last will and testament and I do hereby revoke and make void all
former wills and testaments by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I this
said John Branford to this my last will and testament being contained
in two sheets of paper have set my hand to the top and last sheet thereof and set
my seal the twenty sixth day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand
Seven hundred and twenty one.

South Carolina. In the Name of God Amen. I Thomas Allen
the Parish of Christ Church in Berkeley County and Province of South
Carolina being very much indisposed and weak in body, but of sound and perfect
memory thanks be to God first do make ordain publish and declare
these presents to be and contain my last will and testament, hereby revo-
king, making null and void all former or other wills and testaments
heretofore by me made. First and principally I recommend my
Soul to Allmighty God my Creator, assuredly believing that I shall
receive full pardon and free remission of all my sins and be saved by
the precious death and merits of my blessed Saviour and Redeemer Je-
sus Christ, and my body to the Earth from whence it was taken
to be buried in such decent and Christian manner as my Executors
hereafter named shall see thought fit and convenient and as to
my worldly goods, which it hath pleased God to bless me with my
will and desire is that the same be disposed of as hereafter by this
my last will is expressed. First my will and desire is that all
my just debts and funeral charges be paid and fully discharged by
my Executors hereafter named. Item I give bequeath and devise
my well beloved wife Elizabeth Allen negroes, namely
