The last will & testament of Thomas Bee Sidebunkle J.S. 1849.
 No 49. In the Name of God Amen. The Seventeenth day of December 1849.
 I Thomas Bee of the County of Chester in the State of New York being sick in body but of good and perfect memory, thank be to
 Almighty God and calling to remembrance the uncertainty of this
 transitory life that all flesh must yield unto death I do hereby
 make constitute ordain and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following
 to wit and amending by these presents all and every testament
 and testaments last and truly heretofore by me made and declared
 either by word or writing and this to be taken only for my last will
 and testament and none other And first being penitent and
 sorrow from the bottom of my heart for my sins past, most humbly
 desiring forgiveness for the same I give and commit my soul
 unto Almighty God my Father and Redeemer, in whom, and by
 the merits of Jesus Christ I trust and believe assuredly to be saved
 and to have full remission and forgiveness of all my sins and
 that my soul with my body, at the General day of resurrection,
 shall rise again with joy and through the merits of Christ's death
 and passion possess and inherit the Kingdom of Heavens
 purchased for his elect and chosen; and my body buried in such
 place where it shall please my Executors hereafter named to
 appoint. And now for the settling my temporal estate and such
 goods, chattels and debts as it hath pleased God far above my
 deserts to bestow upon me I do order give and dispose the same
 in manner and form following (that is to say) First I will that all
 those debts and duties as I owe in right or conscience to any manner
 of person or persons whatsoever shall be well and truly confessed
 and paid or ordained to be paid within convenient time after
 my decease by my Executors hereafter named. Item I give and
 bequeath unto my well beloved wife Rachel all the houses and
 the lott at the other improvement thereon where I now dwell, (my
 her natural life) or till such time as my loving son Joseph shall

arrive at the age of twenty one years, if it shall please God to suffer him to arrive to the same, at which time the said houses and land shall be equally divided between my said loving wife and my loving children (viz) Joseph Will, George & Mary, and that said Joseph shall then enjoy his part of the same with his heirs forever and so of the rest each when arrived to age shall enjoy his and her part and their heirs forever, provided nevertheless the said houses and land shall not be sold by any one enjoying the same forever, but shall descend continually to the longest liver and in case my said loving children Joseph Will, George and Mary should happen to die before they arrive at age, then and in that case my loving sons Thomas and John shall be possessed of the same and their heirs forever and for want of such in heir then to my loving brother John Bee this heirs and for want of such in heir then to the nearest in kin and so continually to descend forever. Item. I give and bequeath unto my loving Thomas and John that part of a toll w^{ch} was toll me by my loving sister Mary Smith to be equally divided between them, and to continue in them and their heirs forever, and for want of such heirs then to descend unto the nearest in kin and so continually to descend forever. Item. I give and bequeath unto my loving sister Mary Smith to be equally divided between them, and to continue in them and their heirs forever, and for want of such heirs then to descend unto the nearest in kin and so continually to descend forever. Item. I give and bequeath unto my loving wife the use of the three parlouring staves (viz) Jack, Bessy and Anne till such time as my son Joseph shall arrive at age, and then he shall enjoy a fifth part of the profits of said staves with the rest as they shall grow up and arrive at age but the staves never to be sold but to continue as staves as in case of the toll and houses given. Item. I give and bequeath unto my loving wife all and sundry contents the household goods that I am now possessed of to be enjoyed by her during her natural life and afterwards to be equally divided amongst all my loving child^{ren} then living. Item. I do hereby nominate & appoint my loving brother John Bee & my wife to be of this my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, the day and year above written.

The up^r will was signed sealed published pronounced & declared by the s^d Thomas Bee and his last will & testament in the presence of the subscribers. Richard Lowe, John Smith, John Smith & Benj^t Dennis. Personally came & appeared before me Richard Lowe & John Smith two of the subscribing witnesses to the within will who being duly sworn on the Holy Evangelists of almighty God declare they were present & did see that in named Th^{os} Bee sign seal publish and declare the within instrument to be his last will and testament and that at the time of such his executing the same the s^d Thomas Bee was of sound and disposing mind and understanding to the best of these deponents knowledge and these deponents further say that their names set

these witnesses are of their own handwriting, and that they together wth John Smith & Benj^t Dennis subscribed their names as the s^d Testator's witnesses and at his request. Sworne & made 17th Edm^d die the widow took the oath of an Extra Test. H. H. Cl. Row. R^r. Middleton

On 12th March 1725 Bro Bee renounced his right of qualification and on same day Letters & Warrant were granted by the Hon^{ble} R^r. Middleton to Mr Richard Bee as Executor.

H^{is} The last will and testament of Timothy Bellamy Amblett. To wit
No 1. In the Name of God Amen. I Timothy Bellamy of Charlestown in the Province of South Carolina Merchant being sick in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory Praise be therefore given to almighty God do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following (That is to say) first and principally I commend my soul into the hands of almighty God hoping through the merits death and Passion of my saviour Jesus Christ to have full and free pardon and forgiveness of my sins and to inherit everlasting life and my body I commit to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named And as touching the disposition of all such temporal estate as I have pleased almighty God to bestow upon me I give and dispose thereof as followeth. Imp^t I will that my debts and funeral charges be just paid and discharged. Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Bellamy all that part of a town toll situate lying and being in Charles Town and distinctly known in the model of the said Town by the number (twelve) containing in front thirty six foot or thereabouts and in depth ninety nine feet or thereabouts butting and bounding to the Eastward on land belonging to Mr Isaac Mayjick to the Westward on land now or late belonging to Mr John Kerseys to the Northward on said Broad Street together with the messuage or dwelling house thereon and all and singular the outhouses Edifices buildings gardens fences and other the premises to the same belonging in many wise appertaining to hold the same unto my daughter Sarah her heirs and assigns forever. Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Bellamy all that part of a town toll (viz) and messuage situate in Charles Town aforesaid on the North side of the said Broad Street containing in front thirty feet or thereabouts and in depth one hundred feet or thereabouts butting and bounding to the Eastward on land now belonging to Mr Joseph Wagg to the Westward on one other toll situate
